SPARROW BANDING AT PAUL DICKSON'S DEER FARM

The bird banding at Paul Dickson's deer farm was a great success. We banded 78 individuals of 8 species: **American Goldfinch** 1, **Northern Cardinal** 1, **Swamp Sparrow** 16, **Savannah Sparrow** 10, **Lincoln's Sparrow** 2, **LeConte's Sparrow** 8, **White-crowned Sparrow** 20, and **Song Sparrow** 21. We also captured 3 birds that had been banded previously: **Northern Cardinal** and two **White-crowned Sparrows** one which was banded by Paul on 25 January 1994 and one banded by me on 11 February 1995.

Extralimital Dates: Tanagers through Juncos

This is the eleventh in a series of reports on extralimital dates for migratory birds in our area. It is based exclusively on the Bird Study Group Bird Report data base. The intent of this series is to alert birders of the approximate arrival and departure dates of migrants (based on our data base) and of times during the year in need of better documentation. In some cases, permanent residents (PE) are included if annual data is incomplete. At least six dates (if available) are given for each species. For summer residents (SU) the first three dates are the earliest arrival dates in the spring and the last three dates are the latest departure dates in the fall. For winter residents (WI), the first three dates are the latest departure dates in the spring and the last three are the earliest arrival dates in the fall. The last column gives months for which additional data is needed. For non-resident migrants the first line (SP) contains the earliest three arrival and latest three departure dates for the spring and the second line (FA) gives the earliest arrival and latest departure dates for the fall migration. In some cases fewer than three dates are available for a given category. Accidentals (AC) contain only one or two records.

MINUTES OF THE REGULAR MEETING

The regular meeting of the SSNS Bird Study Group was held February 13, 1996, in the Museum of Life Sciences of LSUS. The meeting was opened at 7:03 PM by President Jim Ingold, who welcomed several guests.

One of the guests spoke for a few minutes regarding 44,000 acres of the Vernon Ranger District in Kisatchie National Forest, being acquired by the U.S. Army to be used as tank training areas. Within those acres are 186 clusters of Red-cockaded Woodpeckers, which is the 3rd largest colony in the world, plants, orchids and much more natural habitat that should be conserved. This acquisition will occur without public knowledge. It was suggested that everyone inform their senators that the public should be made aware of the Army's plans and allowed to have some input into such a devastating situation.

President Ingold then introduced the speaker, Ms. Karen Hagerty who gave a program on The Effects of Bottomland Hardwood Thinning on Neotropical Migrants.

During the business portion of the meeting, we were reminded of the next field trip, being February 17th to Cheneyville, La. on Mr. Wimple's farm for Sandhill Cranes, led by Dr. Bill Hall. Hubert Hervey will lead a trip to Yearwood Road. Meet at the Museum at 7:30 AM on March 2nd. Then on March 16th, Hubert will lead a trip to Ponderosa Farm in the Bodcau Wildlife Management Area for Wild Turkeys. Meet at 6:00 AM (we need to be that early in order to see the turkeys) at LSUS Museum.

Treasurer Betty Mason gave her report: \$2362 balance, Hibernia balance, \$2463.43, \$58.51 - Gift Shop, \$36.33 - Post Office, \$300 to Gift Shop and \$200 to mail to Post Office, About \$500 to Baton Rouge Audubon Society and Caroline Dorman.

Program Chairman Gay Vekovius reported that the April program will be by Bill Vermillion on Partners In Flight.

Bobbe Wommack had agreed to handle Publicity in the absence of Betsy Reisinger, however, we now need someone to take over that position.

Bird Chat - Information from internet revealed that Swainson's Hawks are being killed by pesticides in Argentina with numbers reaching up to 20,000. The Canadian population of these hawks is between 20 and 30 thousand pairs.

Seven birders showed up for the Soda Lake trip. The water level in Soda Lake was very low because the 30 foot uphill distance required to pump the water out of 12-mile bayou is a slow way to fill the impoundment and winter rains have been well below normal. Mallard, Green-winged Teal and Sharp-shinned Hawk were among the 45 species seen.

Paul Dickson's Bird Banding Day on February 10th, netted eight species: 1 American Goldfinch, 1 Northern Cardinal with 1 retrap, 16 Swamp Sparrows, 10 Savannah Sparrows, 2 Lincoln's Sparrows, 8 LeConte's Sparrows, 20 White-crowned Sparrows with 2 retraps, and 21 Song Sparrows. Species observed included a Bald Eagle, Northern Harrier, House Finch, and Eastern Bluebird.

Bird Talk: Some species seen were Pine Siskin, Purple Martin, Henslow's Sparrow, American Woodcock and Inca Dove.

The meeting was adjourned at 8:20 PM.

1. The Short-eared Owl places its nest on the ground usually on small hillocks etc.

6. The Short-eared Owl is related to the Long-eared Owl.
7. There are no breeding records for the Short-eared Owl in Louisiana.
8. Sky dancing is the courtship ritual performed by the male.
