Mama, the Birds, and Me

She was beside herself that warm, sunny morning as I drove up to get her to bring her back to Shreveport so that she could have cataract surgery the following day. As I looked up, I could see the cause for her excitement. Eight to ten **Purple Martins** were circling the open expanse of sky above her gourds and wooden bird houses. My brother tells her, "They are only teasing you, Mama, they only like those 'new fangled' aluminum houses. They won't nest in your gourds." She, of course, knows that this is not so and hopes year after year that they will

decide to take up residence in front of her house. Since she can no longer raise those good ol' vegetables to feed her family in this mowed over garden plot, she relishes the idea of whiling away the hours listening to the birds' melodious songs and watching them soar lazily in the sky. We watched intently as they sat on the highline wires located conveniently close to the houses and gourds, surveying her accommodations. "It's perfect for them," she says. "They like open spaces and wires to perch on! Everything is right here. Stay!! Please stay!!", she pleads.

When we drove up to her house a couple of days later, after she had her surgery, I scouted the skies to see if I could see the **Purple Martins**. "I see some birds up high, Mama, but I can't tell what they are." "I hope it's them," she said. "They've come so many times before and never have stayed, I pray I'm lucky this time."

Before leaving, I had the privilege of watching other birds feeding next to her house. Mama has been an avid bird watcher for years, and she has various types of feeders just outside her living room window and her front door. Her place has always been a commune for **Northern Cardinals**. The ground between her living room window and a tree bank only a few feet away was completely covered with brilliant **Indigo Buntings** and **American Goldfinches**. It is indelibly etched on my mind and will always be a sweet memory no matter what I may encounter in my passion for birding.

Upon arriving home and checking my messages, I heard her excited voice saying, "The **Purple Martins** have built in my gourds. They are staying!" They say, "God works in mysterious ways." I'll say he definitely made an elderly country lady very happy with eyes that can see and something so very beautiful to look at.

HEARD IN McKINNEY, TEXAS

On March 30, 1996 Pat and I had the pleasure

of birding in the McKinney, Texas area. This old east Texas town is on U. S. 75 about 20 miles north of Loop 635, LBJ Freeway in Dallas. Some of our club members have birded just south of McKinney, at Allen, which is known for having several species of longspurs wintering nearby. Allen water tower is where we found our first **McCown's Longspur** a couple of years ago.

I am considering including a trip to McKinney on our next year's outing schedule. To help me make this decision I need your input. I will pass out copies of additional information to those interested at the May meeting, and answer your questions during the June meeting. I think that plan is best so as not to take extra time away from our very special speaker, Nancy Newfield.

The major reason for going would be to tour the grounds and building of The Heard Museum. In addition to being a fine natural history museum, other activities include:

1. A major raptor rehabilitation center,
2. The major bird banding station in Texas,
3. Feeding stations with plate glass windows for viewing,
4. Nature trails up and down the limestone, blackland hills,
5. Native prairie restoration area,
6. Wetland habitat with shorebirds, gulls, ducks, etc.
7. This museum has had visitors from all over the world and the director has agreed to give us their best tour, since we are especially interested in birds, as he is.

The director recommended a visit either in October or May as bird banding will be operating full time, with lots of migrants. We could also combine this trip with a stop at Lake Tawakoni Dam, Paul Matthews Grassland Prairie, or Hagerman NWR depending upon the wishes of the group and the season of the year. Charlie Lyon has mentioned to me that he would be willing to lead us to Lake Tawakoni in the winter. I guarantee we will have fantastic birding.

To get the most from the Heard Museum trip a stay overnight in McKinney would be best. So please come to the meeting and let me know if this interests you. And while I really did hear a lot while in McKinney, that was not what I meant when I titled this article "Heard in McKinney."

ANSWERS TO BIRD QUIZ #42

1. The **Cuban Bee Hummingbird** is the smallest.
2. The **Ruby-throated Hummingbird** is the only one to breed in Louisiana.
3. Ten species of hummingbirds have been recorded in Louisiana, 6 annually.
4. **Anna's Hummingbird** nests the earliest, since it breeds in late winter or early spring.
5. \$1,000! It would take approximately 100,000 **Cuban Bee Hummingbirds** to equal the weight of 1 adult (male) **Ostrich**.
6. 14 North American Hummingbirds have totally black bills: **Green Violet-ear, Lucifer, Bahama Woodstar, Blue-throated, Magnificent, Plain-capped Starthroat, Ruby-throated, Black-chinned, Costa's, Anna's, Calliope, Broad-tailed, Rufous, and Allen's** (based on National Geographic Society Field Guide).
7. The **Broad-billed Hummingbird** has a broad bill to help it catch the insects that make up most of its diet. It eats more insects than any other hummer.
8. The **Ruby-throated Hummingbird** can fly 60 mph.
9. The **Calliope Hummingbird** may use an old nest after refurbishing it.
10. The largest Hummingbird in the U.S. is the **Magnificent Hummingbird** at 5.25 inches; largest hummer in the world is the **Giant Hummingbird** at 8.5 inches.
11. They all are!
