## FIELD TRIPS

**September 28 – Daingerfield State Park.** We will join NETFO for a hawk count at their location north of Lake-O'-the-Pines on Hwy. 49. Meet at Kelly's Truck Stop on I-20 at 8:00 AM. Leader: Hubert Hervey (925-9249). There is an entry fee to enter the state park.

**October 5 – Hervey Farm Hawk Watch** from 10 AM to 3 PM. Come earlier for land birds. Bring lunch and drinks. Leader Hubert Hervey (925-9249).

**Oct.11-13 -- Heard Museum, McKinney Tex.** Attractions include: natural history museum, raptor rehabilitation center, bird banding, bird feeding stations, nature trails, wetland area and native prairie. ## BIRD QUIZ # 45

### CONFUSING FALL WARBLERS

The following questions are based on the warbler species that normally migrate through the Bird Study Group (BSG) observation area. The answers are based on information obtained from: Warblers of the Americas by Jon Curson, David Quinn, and David Beadle.

1. How many warblers and for which species do we have winter records (1 December - 28 February) in the BSG database?
2. Which warbler species have yellow tail spots (in any season or sex or age)?
3. Which warbler species have distinct yellow rump patches (in any season or sex or age)?
4. Which warbler species have yellow wing bars (in any season or sex or age)?
5. Which warbler species have black throats (in any season or sex or age)?
6. Which warbler species show no distinct difference between adult breeding males and adult non-breeding males?

### SODA LAKE OUTING, SEPT. 7, 1996

This was an enjoyable morning of birdwatching. The weather was delightful, warming up to almost hot by 11:00 AM. I had planned to quit early because of the potential for uncomfortably hot weather anyway. Just letting you know that I am sensitive to your needs.

The best birds were: **Wood Stork** (one immature), **Tri-colored Heron** (one immature), **White-breasted Nuthatch**, **Northern Parula** and **Baltimore Oriole**. We enjoyed seeing a **Sharp-shinned Hawk** fly over the LSU parking lot before sunrise. It was escorted out of sight by a flock of **European Starlings**.

We had a problem counting all of the **Chimney Swifts** as we were preparing to leave. They were wheeling and feeding high overhead. The number we turned in (67) is more than any other species and yet is fewer than were actually there. The writer always gets the last word. HA!

### POWHATAN AREA OUTING Sept. 14, 1996

The first stop was an area of water impounded by levees one mile east of the Powhatan I-49 exit. This place has been excellent for two months. We have recorded **Roseate Spoonbill**, **Black Tern**, **American Avocet**, **Tri-colored Heron**, **Black-necked Stilt** and many other water related birds.

We were not to be disappointed on this trip. We studied a plegadis species. First we saw the reddish eye which when combined with the totally dark body and down curved bill, indicated a probable **White-faced Ibis**. In the spring, a **White-faced Ibis** is fairly easy to identify if the

face is well seen. The white markings (feathers) on the face are plain to see, but in the fall, the problem of ruling out a **Glossy Ibis** is more complicated. The skin color between the eye and the lower part of the bill must be seen. The Questar proved its value as it pulled in the pink color we needed to see and all agreed we were observing a **White-faced Ibis**. This is a good fall record for our area.

Next we stopped at Mibermel Plantation, 2-1/2 miles south of Powhatan on Hwy. 1. Farm Manager, John Danley had agreed to let us look for rails and ride the rice combine if he was operating it. However, he had finished all the rice that was ready the preceding afternoon. Therefore, I turned into the rail flusher since I had on the rubber boots. We saw four **Soras**, but the surprise was a small, dark bird that kept running down the only piece of dry land around, the levee between rice field plots. This levee was barely above water level and slightly wider than a man's foot. The dark bird, kept hidden by the overhanging heads of rice, would run ahead, then flush and fly a short distance, and then repeat the entire process. Several times, I was able to see the dark back of the bird as it teetered on the levee. Finally, I saw enough of the creamy breast and belly and the eyeline characteristics necessary to identify a **Northern Waterthrush**. Don't you think this is a strange place to find a waterthrush?

Our third stop was the north end of Sibley Lake at Hwy 504. There we saw one **Roseate Spoonbill**. Later we saw seven more on the I-49 barrow pits, on the east side of the interstate. We also saw a young deer walk out and drink from the lake. I thought it must really be thirsty to come out in the open in the early afternoon like it did.

After a picnic at the lovely pavilion beside the lake, some of us went on to the National Fish Hatchery. There we added more birds to the list, **Northern Shoveler**, **Yellow-crowned Night Heron**, **Western Sandpiper**, **White Ibis** and **Belted Kingfisher**, to name a few. We enjoyed touring the aquarium, which is full of interesting exhibits. It was a nice place to end a fun day of birding.
