**The Double-Crested Cormorant in Northern Lake Michigan**

**NOVEMBER PROGRAM**

**When:** Tuesday, November 12, 6:30 p.m.

**Where:** LSU-Shreveport, Museum of Life Sciences

Our November program will be given by Dr. Beth Leuck of Centenary College on November 12 at 7:00 p.m. The **Double-crested Cormorant** populations increased dramatically during the 1990's. To assess their effects on the fish population of northern Lake Michigan, a team of researchers spent the past three years counting individuals in breeding colonies, collecting regurgitated fish from the colonies, and analyzing the stomach contents of adult birds. Their results indicate that cormorants are opportunistic feeders and that there is no evidence that they are directly targeting small-mouth bass or other game fish.

Dr. Leuck earned her Master's and Ph.D. degree from the University of Oklahoma in zoology and has taught in the biology department of Centenary College for 22 years. Dr. Leuck has been conducting research on Lake Michigan for 17 years on **Double-crested Cormorant** populations.

Meet at the LSUS Museum of Life Sciences. We'll walk the forest trail at Millwood in the morning. After a picnic lunch, we'll explore the lake by barge. Millwood Lake encompasses 29,500 acres and is especially well known for its fall and winter rarities. Long-tailed, Pomarine, and Parasitic Jaegers, Black-legged Kittiwake, and several species of gulls, including Black-headed, Iceland, and Sabine, have visited Millwood on their way south. We are fortunate to have as our guide, Charles Mills, who is not only THE expert on Millwood Lake birds but also the observer of many of the aforementioned birds.

The barge will leave the dock at 1:00 p.m. If you wish to participate in the barge trip only, let me know when you make your reservations.

Dress warmly. Temperatures on the lake will be colder than on the land, so you will want to bring extra layers of clothing for the barge trip. The barge is being provided courtesy of the Millwood Lake State Park Superintendent at a fee of \$1.00 per participant to cover the cost of fuel. The barge capacity is 24 persons, so there should be plenty of room for all, but reservations are required.

**What to bring:** Warm clothes, including hat, scarf or neck gator, gloves, picnic lunch, hot drinks.

## THE BIG SIT! 2002

The forecast for Sunday, October 13, predicted cloudy, overcast skies, 15 to 20 mph winds, and temperatures in the 60's. Not an auspicious day for birdwatching it seemed. Every self-respecting bird would be hunkered down in some dense foliage holding on for dear life, or so we thought. Undaunted, the Big Sitters determined to do the best we could under adverse conditions. Jerry Bertrand and I arrived at Bickham Dickson Park at 6:30 a.m. The front had not moved in and the weather before dawn was warm and muggy. In the distance, a **Great Horned Owl** hooted. And so the Big Sit of 2002 commenced with the last bird of the 2001 Big Sit.

Dawn had not broken when Laurie Robertson arrived to help set up, hoping to add some owls to her list. By now, cardinals were chipping, **Carolina Chickadees** were chattering, and **Carolina Wrens** were singing in the woods. A few minutes after 7 a.m., Charlie Lyon showed up carrying his scope and no chair. Although we did not realize it at the time, "no chair" was significant in more ways than one. Charlie had been monitoring the weather and believed (contrary to the opinion of the less-experienced-with-the-effect-of-weather-patterns-on-bird-movement birders) that the day could bring some good stuff. Jeff Trahan walked up with his scope a few minutes later followed by ME (Mary Ellen) Lewis and Betsy Moreland, who drove from Claiborne Parish for the Sit. Linda Adrion, taking a break from her usual combined activity of golf-birding, Jean Trahan and Rosemary Seidler were hot on their heels and what would become known as the "2002 Big Sit and Hawk Watch" began in earnest.

Earlier in the week, we had baited the field with platform and hanging feeders and sprinkled mixed seed and corn in bare areas under trees, by the fence, and along the road. The only takers the day of the Sit were a few cardinals on the platform feeders and some **Mourning Doves** under a tree. Jerry found deer tracks by the seed on the road and one of a group of horseback riders heading to the back of the park said that her horse had discovered the seed on Saturday. So, although we may not have fed many birds, we did attract some critters. If we ever have a deer or horse count, we'll know what to do. We had hung two nectar feeders and Laurie found a **Ruby-throated Hummingbird**, one of our first birds of the day, perched in the tree near one of the feeders. We

determined to put out all the feeders at least two weeks in advance next year.

Although the rest of us had brought chairs, they went virtually unused for the first hours, as the Big Sit became the Big Stand. We milled about in our circle, alternating between periods of scanning the skies and staring into the woods, and pondering such weighty questions as to just how many birders you could put in a 17-foot circle. Late in the day, Charlie remarked and later

repeated in his post to the BSG Bird Alert service that he never thought he could have stayed in one place for so long. My reply was, "Charlie, you haven't." When he wasn't checking out birds through the spotting scope, he was beating the woods, tape player in hand, attempting to summon up birds to perch where we could see them. This was harder than it might seem. Charlie would call out a bird and a location, while those of us directionally challenged would say, "Where, where? In the willow? What's a willow look like? I don't see it. Do you see it?" Jean Trahan, ever the eagle eye, although her specialty is usually large birds at impossible distances, managed to see a **Black-throated Green Warbler**. But some birds remained elusive. The rules are that, although you may leave the circle to identify a bird, someone in the circle must be able to see or hear that bird. For this reason, despite being sighted by Charlie in the woods, **Tufted Titmouse** was a heard-only bird.

As the arctic front moved in, the significance of the park's location next to the Red River was apparent. Migrating birds following the river south flew over our heads. Strong flying **Greater White-fronted Geese** led the way. By the end of the day, 367 had passed over us. Then came the raptors: 51 **Broad-winged Hawks**, 10 **Sharp-shinned Hawks**, 5 **Red-tailed Hawks**, 3 **Red-shouldered Hawks**, 3 **Cooper's Hawks**, 2 **Osprey**, a **Peregrine Falcon**, and an **American Kestrel**. One would have thought we were at Hazel Bazemore Park in Corpus Christi. Okay, maybe not, but the numbers were

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very impressive for northwest Louisiana. Large migrating flocks of non-raptors included 59 **White Ibis** and 300 **American Robins**.

By 8:30 a.m., 41 of the day's 68 birds had been spotted or heard. Although many of these 41 species would be sighted again during the day, several were neither heard nor seen again after 8:30, including **Great Horned Owl**, **Northern Waterthrush**, **Lesser Yellowlegs** and **Common Snipe**. In our case, the Van Remsen "the early birder catches the bird" theory held true. This theory, recently posted to LABIRD, the Louisiana Bird Alert service, by Van, Director of the LSU Museum of Natural Sciences in Baton Rouge, states that 50% of your day's birds can be seen in the time period beginning a half hour before dawn and ending approximately one hour after dawn. The idea seems to be that if you get up really early and start birding before dawn, you will be able to compress your birding into a much shorter period of time, so that you can go home early. To do what, I don't know, probably to take a nap.

The great Neotropic Cormorant/Anhinga debate took place later in the day. Jeff, Rosemary, Jean, and Jerry spotted a bird, which they initially identified as an Anhinga. Charlie got it in his scope and identified it as a Neotropic Cormorant. Jean, amidst accusations from Jeff and Rosemary of being a traitor, sided with Charlie because he saw it through his scope. After listening to Charlie's description of differences between the two species and a field guide consultation, Jerry also agreed with Charlie. The remaining Big Sit participants prudently refused to become involved. After much bickering, uh, excuse me, discussion, the debate was amicably (more or less) settled with the decision that the bird was a Neotropic Cormorant.

Toward afternoon, Rosemary and Jean found a **Green Heron** in the ditch where the culverts run under the road. Hoping to flush the bird so it could be seen from the Big Sit circle, Charlie walked down the ditch while Rosemary clapped her hands loudly. Instead of flying up, the bird only flew further away along the ditch. Later in the day, the bird, unfazed by the earlier attack, returned to the same spot in the ditch. This time, master tactician Jeff Trahan walked through the woods to approach the heron from the other end of the ditch, while Rosemary again clapped her hands at our end. This worked; the heron flew up into one of the dead trees across the road from us and posed for several

minutes, as if to say, "I don't know what the problem is with you people that you can't let a bird sit peacefully, but here I am, take a good look, because it's the last you'll see of me today."

For the preceding two years, **Vermilion Flycatchers** have been seen in October at Bickham Dickson Park and one has stayed the winter each year. The first sightings last year were during the week after the Big Sit. This year, not one but two birds, an adult male and an immature male, had been seen in the park on a regular basis for over a week before the Sit. Hoping against hope that at least one would leave the easy insect pickings over by the lake long enough to be counted from the circle, we were elated when one was spotted flying across the far end of the field. In 2001, circles in Arizona, Texas, and Mexico were the only ones to report **Vermilion Flycatchers**. This year, the exotic location of Shreveport, Louisiana, will join that elite list.

As the day wore on, Bill Wood joined us, Jim Ingold dropped by, and Mac Hardy arrived to bird and hunt spiders. Participants gradually faded away until, by late afternoon, only Mac, Jerry, and I were left. Lily Poole, who had just gotten off work, came to finish out the day with us. Near dusk, we added our 68<sup>th</sup> and last species of the day, as **Common Nighthawks** performed acrobatics overhead. Finally, at 7:30 p.m., Jerry and I, alone again as we had been at the beginning of the Big Sit, packed up our belongings and headed home, as the eerie call of an **Eastern Screech Owl** sounded in the woods.

Postscript: Species counted during the 2001 Big Sit missing in 2002 included **Little Blue Heron**, **Tricolored Heron**, and **Cattle Egret** (the absence of last year's "heronoid" roost hurt us here), **Black Vulture**, **Northern Harrier** (both male and female flew low directly over us last year), **Hairy Woodpecker**, and **Loggerhead Shrike** (present by the lake, but not venturing to our side of the park).

**MINUTES OF THE REGULAR MEETING**

*October 8, 2002, 7:00 p.m.,  
Museum of Life Sciences at LSU*

Bill Weyman made a presentation of his favorite videos from the United States, Africa, and Central America along with personal comments and tips on how to take video.

**Treasurer's Report** - Jean Trahan reported that on August 31 the club had \$2,117.34 in the bank. In addition, we had \$519.66 and \$272.44 in prepaid expenses at the post office and LSU printing, respectively. The fund balance is \$2,909.44. Meet at 5:45 a.m. in the Brookshires parking lot at the corner of Barksdale Boulevard and LA 511. On Saturday, November 9, Larry Raymond will lead a bird walk at Eddie D. Jones Nature Park. Participants will meet at 7:30 a.m. at the Museum of Life Sciences.

**Bumper Stickers** - Lily Poole showed several bumper stickers that she developed. Bill Wood showed another that he had worked on. Club members were asked to select which they thought would work best.

**Membership** - Lily Poole reported that we have 100 paid accounts and that half are family accounts.

**Newsletter** - Bill Wood solicited more articles for upcoming newsletters.

**Bird Talk** - Nancy Menasco and Jerry Bertrand saw a **Sooty Tern** on the Red River near Bishop Point. They also saw four **Roseate Spoonbills** and several *Plegadis* near mile marker 208 that they could not specifically identify. Rosemary Seidler saw about 1,600 **Chimney Swifts** flying down river near the Hollywood Casino downtown on the Red River. Linda Adrion saw two **Vermilion Flycatchers** at Bickham Dickson Park. One was an adult male, the other an immature male. On September 21, Charlie Lyon saw nine **Common Terns** on the Red River near Bishop Point and seven more on Cross Lake. In addition he saw a **Peregrine Falcon** and 248 **Caspian Terns** on the Red River.

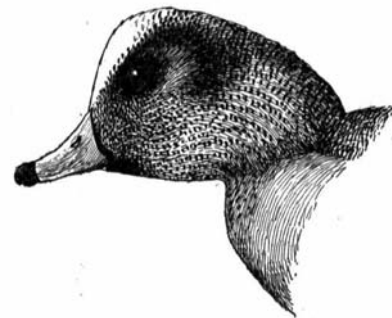
