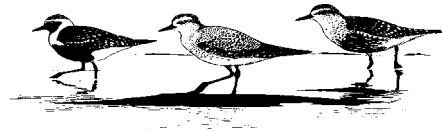
### LOS SPRING MEETING - CAMERON, LA

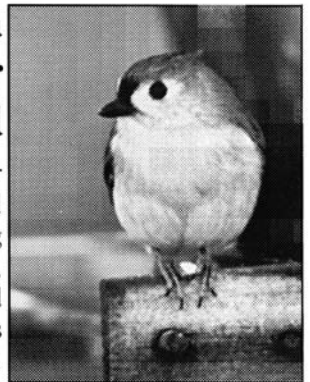

## GREAT BACKYARD BIRD COUNT AFTERMATH

Unlike the Christmas Bird Counts (CBC) and the North American Migration Count (NAMC), the primary focus of the Great Backyard Bird Count (GBBC) is on common birds and keeping them common. Birders being birders, we find it hard to stop with our backyards. So, after duly recording the yard birds, we take to the roads to count everything we can find. With four days in which to count, we avoid the somewhat frenetic pace of the one-day CBC's and NAMC and bird at our leisure (at least until final count day). No other count provides us with the immediate gratification of being able not only to track our area's results online but to target species missed on previous days of the count. And so, a friendly competition develops.

We analyze seasonal occurrence charts, field trip reports, and database listings to plan our strategy. We confer with our fellow birders as we meet them on the road. "Did you get the Purple-throated Whatsis on Highway 1?" "No, but we got Lesser Magenta Whatchamacallits on Cross Lake." Ultimately, it's not about the number of species we see, but what we learn and the fun we have while adding to the body of knowledge of our feathered cohabiters of this earth.

That said, let's get back to our friendly competition. As of Friday, February 21, Shreveport was in first place in Louisiana and 22<sup>nd</sup> place in the United States and Canada with 102 species, Homer was in third place in Louisiana with 69, Stonewall was in sixth place with 64, and Keithville was in ninth place with 54 species. We won't know the final results until after February 28, the deadline for turning in checklists, at which time write-in species will be added to the totals.

We asked BSG'ers to comment on their Great Backyard Bird Count experience. Here's what they said:

*Hubert Hervey:* This was my first GBBC, because I have always preferred birding at exceptionally birdy locations to sitting around waiting for birds to show up, unless hawks are involved, in which case I'll take them wherever I can find them. The thing I like the most about doing this count is that I can do it at my convenience, working in birding times around other activities. Therefore the Hours Spent column on the report form is rather meaningless, as the feeder watching bird hours are impossible to report accurately. I also enjoyed watching the counts add numbers from day to day. The idea to have a four day count is very clever as it motivates participants from day to day to seek out species missed. That was especially important this year due to the adverse

weather encountered on the first three days of the count,. Windy, rainy, and cold conditions limited my success, though I did report the **Spotted Towhee**. However, those same conditions were responsible for my best surprise bird, two **Ross' Goose** about a mile and a half from the house. All of my birding was done within four miles of the farm, all in DeSoto Parish and north and east of Stonewall. I'm already looking forward to next year.

*Rosemary Seidler:* Linda Adrion and I birded South Lakeshore, North Lakeshore, and West Lakeshore. I'm sure that she can tell a better story than I. (Why would she think that I would stop somewhere to get something to eat?) Jeff Trahan and I noticed the lack of **Hooded Merganser** on the Shreveport list so we zipped out between classes to Highway 71 north of town to get them. If we had had more time we'd have gone back to Yearwood road to hunt down a **Harris's Sparrow**. It was fun.

*Linda Adrion:* I am a better birder because of Rosemary. She shared her food and taught me so much, like how to hold and focus binoculars with my right hand while feeding my face with my left. I am forever in her debt.

*ME Lewis:* I birded at our home on Lake Claiborne morning and afternoon all four days, made two trips to the North Louisiana Hill Farm and other locations on Lake Claiborne. Youngsters also participated in "bird activities." In Girl Scouting, the girls younger than "Brownies" are "Daisies" (kindergarten age). Two "Daisies," a "Cadette" and their troop leader visited my residence for the bird count.

Since it was cold and wet that afternoon in Homer, we all sat on the living room floor next to the big windows with paper and pencil in hand. With this ringside seat each participant had a "bird profile sheet" depicting several common feeder birds. Hopefully we'd see the birds and be able to match color, shape, size, etc., to the picture. Brilliant red **Northern Cardinals** really stole the show with the girls counting 17 species.

Then, it was outside to the covered porch, where it was at least dry if not warm, to make pine cone, peanut butter and bird seed feeders. After refreshments, it was time to load up and drive home to Homer.

I'm very proud of Homer! This year two schools, the library, the state park, and the Scouts were involved, plus two garden clubs and the DAR ladies.

*Nancy Menasco and Jerry Bertrand:* Our checklist from Sunday included **Barn Owl**, **Eastern Screech-Owl**, **Vesper Sparrow**, **Brewer's Blackbird**, and **American Woodcock** to add to the list of reported species for Shreveport zip codes. The Trahans and the team of Rosemary Seidler and Linda Adrion each had sightings of **Lincoln's Sparrow**. This is a write-in and apparently takes awhile to be included the totals.

We visited the **Harris's Sparrow** location on Yearwood Road twice with no luck, lots of **White-crowned Sparrows** and a smaller number of **White-throated Sparrows** there though. We tried for **Short-eared Owls**, also with no result, but while playing the Short-eared Owl tape, we heard an **American Woodcock** call and then it flew across the road near us.

We ran into the Trahans at Lock & Dam #5 Sunday. They birded Bishop Point and Highway 1 back to Shreveport while we did Yearwood Road. Earlier in the day, we found two **Brewer's Blackbirds** and one **Eurasian Collared-Dove** at the intersection of Highways 1 and 175. We found the **Vesper Sparrows**, **American Woodcock**, **Wilson's Snipe**, **Barn Owl** and **Eastern Screech-Owl** on Yearwood. We had already birded Hart's Island Road on the way south, where we had three **Fox Sparrows** and seven **Brown Thrashers**. The Trahans had birded Hart's Island on Saturday. I know they did Bickham Dickson, don't know what day(s), but that's where they had **Great Horned Owl** and, of course, **Vermilion Flycatcher**. We did some late birding at CBD Saturday. Jerry wanted to take our neighbors' canoe out for a little while. I stayed on land and had a **Purple Martin**. He spotted a **Cooper's Hawk** from the canoe, which was the only Cooper's turned in so far.

Linda Adrion, Jerry, and I rechecked a couple of Cross Lake locations on Monday, hoping for **Marsh Wren** (unsuccessfully) and then did some Highway 71 and Old River Road area birding. We picked up nine **Northern Shovelers** on Highway 71, but Rosemary and Jeff had been there before us and had spotted ten of them along with two **Hooded Mergansers**, which we missed. Across the road from the ducks was a field where Jerry

counted over 950 **American Crows**.

Postscript: During the count period, there was a distinct lack of variety in our backyard bird species list, which was mainly dominated by that ubiquitous interloper, the **House Sparrow**, with not much more than our faithful little **White-throated Sparrows** to brighten the scene. Of course, since then we've been visited by three **House Finches** and three **Inca Doves** who were apparently just waiting until the count was over to drop in.

*Bill Wood:* On the way home of the first day of the count I spotted a single **American Woodcock** flying south across the road at the intersection of Bert Kouns and Linwood Avenue. After it flew across Bert Kouns, it disappeared into a grassy area across the street from the McDonald's. I would rather have added it to my Keithville area count but Shreveport got this one.

I only got to bird Friday and Saturday morning and for a few hours Sunday in an effort to keep Keithville in the Top 10 for a third year in a row. I missed several species from last year, **Pine Siskin**, **Fish Crow**, **Purple Martin**, and **Rusty Blackbird** but added **Ruby-crowned Kinglet**, **Field Sparrow**, and **Savannah Sparrow** for the first time. I also got **Ring-billed Gull**, **Rock Dove**, and **Brown-headed Nuthatch** that I missed last year. I lucked out with **Inca Dove** by seeing one fly across the road on the way to my brothers house. Looks like I barely made the Louisiana Top Ten list this year holding onto the number 10 spot!

*Paul Dickson:* My boys were in a Lacrosse tournament last weekend. We were gone from home all weekend but I did get out early Sunday morning for an hour. I saw the **Broad-tailed Hummingbird** at my feeder. Another yard local for me is **White-breasted Nuthatch**.

At the deer farm where we will band the ducks, I had a few species which you might have missed: **Northern Pintail**, **American Wigeon**, **Gadwall**, **Green-winged Teal**, **Blue-winged Teal**, **Pied-billed Grebe**, **Vesper Sparrow**, and the usual sparrow mix.

*Lily Poole:* I had to wait around the nest until the eagles came to roost but I was finally able to see and hear the **Bald Eagles** at 4:30 p.m. The temperature was 35 degrees, drizzly & windy. I must have been crazy to stay. Other good birds were three **Eastern Towhees** and two **Hermit Thrushes**. My best yard bird was a **Purple Finch** that my 'non-birding' husband Barney spotted, "Hey, there's different kind of 'red' bird at 'your' feeder..."

**BIRD NAME CHANGES***By Mac Hardy*

The 43<sup>rd</sup> Supplement to the American Ornithologists' Union "Check-list of North American Birds" was recently published in the Auk (vol. 119, no. 3, p. 897-906, 2002). There are four changes that effect us directly and another (maybe more) that potentially could effect us in the future. Only a single change involves a common name.

The scientific name of the **Roseate Spoonbill** has been changed to *Platalea ajaja* from *Ajaja ajaja*. Its sequence is unchanged.

The scientific name of the **Purple Gallinule** has been changed to *Porphyrio martinica* from *Porphyryula martinica*. Its sequence is unchanged.

The common name of the **Common Snipe** has been changed to **Wilson's Snipe** and its scientific name has been changed to *Gallinago delicata* from *Gallinago gallinago*. Its sequence is unchanged.

The scientific name of the **Blue Grosbeak** has been moved to the genus *Passerina* so it is now known as *Passerina caerulea* rather than *Guiraca caerulea*. Its sequence is unchanged.

Now for the potential change. This change does NOT effect our bird list at this time; however, the species might be detected in our area eventually. If it is found it better be by us. The **Black-crested Titmouse** (*Baeolophus atricristatus*) is now recognized as genetically distinct from our **Tufted Titmouse** but thus far, according to the AOU Checklist Committee, can only be distinguished vocally. The distribution of the **Black-crested Titmouse** includes Grimes county, just east of Bryan, Texas. That is only about 150 airline miles from Caddo parish, Louisiana.

The number of species recognized as occurring in the *Check-list* area (main list) is now 2,030 (from 2,023). The complete list of bird species known in the AOU *Check-list* area may be accessed at <http://www.AOU.org/aou/birdlist.html>.

**MINUTES OF THE BOARD MEETING**

February 4, 2003, 7:00 p.m.

Museum of Life Sciences at LSUS

Board members present at the meeting were Mac Hardy, Jeff Trahan, Hubert Hervey, Nancy Menasco, Larry Raymond, Lily Poole, Linda Adrion, and Jean Trahan.

**Science Fair** - Mac Hardy reported that the Regional Science Fair will take place March 14, 2003. The club will sponsor an award for the best project on birds and/or birding. We will award a \$50 savings bond and a plaque for the best project. Amanda Crnkovic will judge the fair and award the prizes for the club.

**Blue Bird Boxes** - Mac Hardy said Holly Martin from Earth Team has 300 bluebird boxes that they want to install in Caddo Parish. Larry Raymond said that the club could put most of them up in Eddie Jones Park.

**Periodical Mailing Permit** - Mac Hardy has acquired information about a periodical mailing permit that the club might want to use rather than the bulk mailing permit. Mac has acquired a manual on the topic and reports that the advantage of using the periodical mailing permit is that periodicals are given priority over other mail and that we would not have to mail a minimum of 200 pieces at a time as we have to with bulk mailing. The cost of applying is a one-time fee of \$375.00 that is not refundable. At this time, we pay an annual fee of \$150.00 for bulk mailing. One problem is that we must report the number of periodicals that we printed and account for each one when we do periodical mailing. Mac said that he would study the manual and report back to the board.

**Gulf Coast Birding Trail** - Mac Hardy reported that a person named Sima from Brown and Caldwell Consulting Co. have the project of developing the Gulf Coast Birding Trail. They are looking for an advisory group and asked if the BSG would do that. They need ideas about user needs, what to consider and ideas for design. If we give them ideas for design, they would design it. The board decided that the club needs more information before making a decision. Brown and Caldwell should send a statement of their expectations in writing including what kind of compensation they would offer. Mac said he would contact them to find out more information.

**Black-headed Grosbeak** - Mac Hardy said that Alvin Astrup in Greenwood has been hosting a **Black-headed Grosbeak** in his backyard. Mac distributed a map of how to get to Mr. Astrup's house and said that Mr.

Astrup would be glad to have visitors in their backyard to see the bird. Alvin has already taken good video of the bird and will show it at the next club meeting.

**Field Trips** - Nancy Menasco reported on future field trips. The Great Backyard Bird Count will take place on February 14 through 18. Bird banding at Paul Dickson's deer farm will be February 22, and a field trip to Bickham Dickson Park will be led by Bill Wood on March 23. Joan Brown will help lead the field trip to Mollicy; Black Bayou Lake and Tensas River NWR March 1 and 2. Nancy wanted to get permission to buy Joan lunch that day. The board agreed.

## MINUTES OF THE REGULAR MEETING

**Program** - Hubert Hervey presented a program for beginning birders called Birding 102.

**Announcements** - Mac Hardy said that Lonnie Gilly would be the new publicity chairman. Mac also said that Earth Team of National Resources Conservation Service has built bluebird houses and is looking for volunteers to put up 50 of them in Caddo Parish. Anyone who wants to take some home and mount them by February 28 may do so. There were many bluebird houses sitting on tables in the room at the time.

**Treasurer's Report** - Jean Trahan reported that on January 31, the club had \$2,203.75 in the bank. In addition we had \$422.64 and \$390.84 in prepaid expenses at the post office and LSU printing, respectively. The fund balance is \$3,017.23. Net income for the month of January was \$105.57, and expenses were \$297.57.

**Field Trips** - Nancy Menasco reported on future field trips. The Tensas River NWR trip will be March 1 and 2. We will visit Mollicy Farms and Black Bayou Lake on Saturday. Nancy said that the Wildbird Center has bird walks two Saturdays a month starting at 8:00 a.m. at the Wildbird center. The Great Backyard Bird Count is February 14 through 17. Nancy reminded everyone to report his or her sightings to the Great Backyard Bird Count and to the BSG. Lilly Poole will be going to see the eagles at Cypress Lake on Sunday at 1:30 p.m. If you would like to accompany her, contact her by phone or email.

**Membership** - Lilly Poole reported 102 paid members.

**Bird Talk** - Alvin Astrup told the group about the **Black-headed Grosbeak** recently seen at the feeders in

his backyard. He showed the wonderful video of the bird that he took. Rosana Shelby reported a white-tailed **Common Grackle** in her yard. She also reported another that had white on its back. Nancy and Jerry Menasco said that they recently saw **Red-cockaded Woodpeckers** at Indian Creek near Alexandria, Louisiana.

## CONGRESS APPROVES FUNDS FOR RED RIVER WILDLIFE REFUGE

**T**his week Congress appropriated \$3.9 million for the acquisition of land for the Red River National Wildlife Refuge. The money will be used to purchase two tracts currently held for RRNWR by the Louisiana Nature Conservancy and a portion of the headquarters site currently held by The Conservation Fund. These two conservation organizations have been key to the success of land acquisitions for RRNWR and are due our deepest appreciation. Congressman Jim McCrery and Senator Breaux and Landrieu made great efforts to land these funds. We owe them our thanks as well. The TNC tracts lie along the Red River and contain both forest and grassland, all top quality neo-tropical bird habitat. They contain rice fields and former catfish ponds which will provide excellent waterfowl and shorebird staging habitat. Moreover, the fact that one tract borders the Red River for about a mile, puts the refuge on the river itself thus opening up the door to USFWS aid to the river system's wildlife. The TNC tracts lie only 25 minutes south of Shreveport. The headquarters tract adjoins the city limits of Bossier City.

**BIRD REPORT** - *Compiled February 25, 2003*

Report bird records for the newsletter to Mac Hardy by the 15th of each month. Following each species is a line of data in the following format: date, initials of observer, number of birds observed, initials of another observer, number of birds observed, etc. For example: 01/12/99 PD two means that on 01/12/99 PD saw 2 birds. For the number of birds observed, a 1 is used both for 1 specimen and for numbers not reported by the observer. All bird records reported here are the responsibility of the observer. The Bird Study Group is reporting observations on the word of the observers.
