# The Endangered Black-capped Vireo

*by Dr. David Cimprich*

### FEBRUARY PROGRAM

**When:** Tuesday, February 10, 6:30 p.m.

**Where:** LSU-Shreveport, Museum of Life Sciences

Dr. David Cimprich of The Nature Conservancy will present a program on the endangered **Black-capped Vireo**. For the past 2½ years, Dr. Cimprich has worked for The Nature Conservancy's Fort Hood Project in Central Texas. His responsibility is to oversee monitoring of the large population of the endangered **Black-capped Vireo** that breeds on the installation. His presentation will profile this species, the studies he has conducted on it, and how it coexists with activities on the U.S. Army's largest tank training area.

Dr. Cimprich obtained an Associate's Degree in Wildlife Management from Hocking College (Nelsonville, OH), a Bachelor's and Master's degree in Zoology, a Master's in Science Education from Ohio State University, and a Ph.D. in Biology from the University of Southern Mississippi. For his doctorate, he studied predator avoidance behavior of songbirds during migratory stopover. Some of you may remember that he gave a presentation here on that research three years ago.

The BSG will be taking a field trip to Fort Hood on May 1 and 2, 2004, to see the **Black-capped Vireo** up close and in person.

### INDIAN CREEK RECREATION AREA, WOODWORTH, LA

Meet at the LSUS Museum of Life Sciences. Indian Creek Recreation Area is located south of Alexandria in the Alexander State Forest in Rapides Parish and includes the 2,250-acre Indian Creek Lake. Target birds include **Red-cockaded Woodpecker** and **Bachman's Sparrow**. Plan on moderate walking on the two-and-a-half mile long Indian Creek Nature Trail. The trail winds through a mixed pine-hardwood forest and "traverses uplands and minor stream bottoms, providing access to a variety of habitats supporting numerous plant and animal species." If you are not up to walking the trail, there are paved roads throughout the area and a number of sites where you can just sit and wait for the birds to come to you. Restrooms are located onsite. There is an entrance fee of \$3.00 per vehicle. We will lunch at Lea's Restaurant in Lecompte and then spend a couple of hours birding by car looking for **Sandhill Cranes** and other area birds. We will be back in Shreveport by dark but participants may leave the field trip whenever they wish.

**BISHOP POINT AND SMITHPORT LAKE DAM***Saturday, March 27, 2004, 8:00 a.m.*

Meet at the LSUS Museum of Life Sciences. The Bishop Point area, located just north of Lock and Dam #5 (Caddo Parish Side), is one of our newest Hot Spots. The habitat includes grassland, cattail marshes, ponds, woods, and the Red River. Most areas can be viewed from the road between the dam to Bishop Point. From Bishop Point, we will continue on to Smithport Lake to look for **Northern Parulas** and other early migrants. Last year's March 23 field trip to these areas turned up 73 species, including five wren species. Plan on some light walking. Bishop Point has Port-o-lets. At the dam there are restrooms that may or may not be available. Bring snacks, drinks, two-way radios, and your scope. Bring a lunch or plan to pick up a burger or sandwich at the Martins' store, which is located on LA 1 at the turn to the dam and Bishop Point.

Learn the basics in our backyard bird feeding class. Victoria Williams will show you how to attract birds to your backyard. Learn how to choose a feeder, select the proper seed, and landscape for wildlife.

**The Great Backyard Bird Count***by Allison Wells, Cornell Lab of Ornithology*

Developed and managed by the Cornell Lab of Ornithology and Audubon, with sponsorship in part from Wild Birds Unlimited stores and the Natural Resources Conservation Service (a division of the USDA), the GBBC will help researchers understand the status of the birds that people all over North America so enjoy. Participants simply keep track of the birds they see on any or all of the count days, then log their sightings into the BirdSource database at [www.birdsource.org/gbbc](http://www.birdsource.org/gbbc). This year's count encourages participants to become more "bird-friendly" in their day-to-day lives, everything from getting their families interested in birds to creating bird habitat in their backyards.

**A Snapshot of Last Year's Great Backyard Bird Count Findings***by Allison Wells, Cornell Lab of Ornithology*

Last winter, as part of the Great Backyard Bird Count (GBBC), bird enthusiasts across North America submitted some 50,000 checklists totaling more than four million birds of 512 species. The event, one of the largest citizen-science projects in the world, documented regional declines of the **American Crow** that may be the result of West Nile virus in those regions. Crows, for example, are particularly vulnerable to the virus and were reported in far fewer numbers in Illinois and Ohio, where West Nile virus has had a strong presence, backing findings from the Christmas Bird Count and a winter-long citizen-science project, Project FeederWatch. "This decrease may or may not be related to West Nile, but the situation is certainly something we need to pay attention to," says John Fitzpatrick, director of the Cornell Lab of Ornithology.

Some species showed increases last year during the GBBC. Participants in the East counted more **Dark-eyed Juncos** than they had since GBBC 2000, perhaps because of the massive snowstorm that hit the eastern seaboard during the weekend of the count, driving birds to feeders in high numbers. That same snowstorm apparently held early migrants like **Red-winged Blackbird**, **Eastern Meadowlark**, and **American Woodcock** farther south, compared to previous years.

In the West, **Mountain Bluebirds** were reported farther south than the year before, and all of the **rosy finches (Black, Gray-crowned, Brown-capped)** were documented farther north. In previous years, GBBC maps of **Eurasian Collared-Doves**, introduced in the Bahamas before reaching Florida in the 1980s, showed

the species spreading quickly northwestward. Last year's maps show no change, suggesting a slowdown in the rate at which the bird's range is spreading.

How will this winter compare to the last six? What will it reflect about our bird populations? The participation of novice and expert bird watchers alike will help us answer these questions. "We need every birder to participate with us," said Frank Gill. "The Great Backyard Bird Count has become an important means of gathering data to help birds, but it can't happen unless people take part. Whether you're a novice or an expert, we need you to help us help birds."

## BSG Plans for the Great Backyard Bird Count of 2004

Last year Shreveport took first place among Louisiana cities with a total of 104 species for the four days of the 2003 Great Backyard Bird Count (GBBC) with Homer, Stonewall, and Keithville joining Shreveport in the top ten. Shreveport was also only 13 species short of being in the top ten cities in the entire United States. According to the BSG database, over 170 species of birds have been sighted in the month of February in the BSG area, so topping our 2003 total is definitely within the realm of possibility. But the GBBC is not just about counting birds; it's also about becoming more bird-friendly in our everyday lives by creating habitat in our yards and by encouraging others, especially children, to become interested in birding. To these ends, the BSG recommends the following:

- Organize a mini-field trip and sign up for a bird or birds from the BSG target bird list. The list includes birds on the Audubon Watch List and some of the harder-to-find local birds. The list and a locator chart can be found online at: [www.softdisk.com/comp/birds/SelectCheck.html](http://www.softdisk.com/comp/birds/SelectCheck.html). Also available on this webpage is a checklist for your use for the GBBC. The checklist has been developed from February sightings on Jeff Trahan's Chart of Seasonal Occurrences. There will be sign-up sheets at the February meeting for organizers and participants of mini-field trips or you may post details and contact information to the online Bird Alert Service. Two Mini-field trips are already planned. Nancy Menasco and Jerry Bertrand will target **Virginia Rails**

at dawn near Cross Lake, owl prowls, and bird the Red River by boat. Nancy says, "anyone is welcome to join us on any of our trips; however, our boat will only hold two people. If you have a canoe and would like to be towed from Bishop Point to the nearby sandbars and back (weather permitting), we have done this with the Trahans without mishap. Contact me or Jerry at [nmcpa@aol.com](mailto:nmcpa@aol.com) or [jeb1954@aol.com](mailto:jeb1954@aol.com) or 868-3255." Lily, Barney, and Jason Poole will bird Cross Lake by boat (tentative). Contact Lily at [leg2bap@earthlink.net](mailto:leg2bap@earthlink.net) or 687-2994 if you would like to join this trip.

- Organize a bird walk through your neighborhood or at a park for your own children or grandchildren or other group of youngsters or invite them to count backyard birds with you. Be sure to have supplies such as a backyard bird checklist for each participant, backyard bird recognition charts, and one or more field guides for reference. Binoculars may have to be shared, but try to let each child get a good look at one or more birds through the binoculars. Make feeders out of recycled materials such as oatmeal boxes or milk jugs or make up a batch of peanut butter no-melt suet and pack in pine cones. Serve refreshments.
- Give a simple presentation at a nearby library, church, school, or Community Renewal Center, on backyard birds, habitat preservation, and the GBBC. The Bird Study Group and the Museum of Life Sciences have materials that you can use in your presentation. - Make tea and cookies and invite the neighbors to watch your backyard birds.
- Invite a new birder and/or member of the BSG to join you on a birding trip or to come watch your backyard birds.

## A Prairie Tale

We came from near and far, from north, south, east, and west, to converge in Franklin County, Texas, for the weekend of November 29-30, 2003. We had come to visit Daphne Prairie, a one-thousand-acre remnant of virgin tallgrass prairie located just north of the town of Mount Vernon. The tallgrass prairies once stretched across 20 million acres of Texas from San Antonio to the Red River, but now less than five percent remains. Beginning in the late 1800s, acre by acre, the prairies fell

to the plow and today a virgin prairie the size of Daphne is very rare. Daphne has fortuitously been owned by the same family since the 1830s and has been used over the years as a hay meadow. The infrequent mowing has actually contributed to the prairie's well-being by stimulating grasses and eliminating brush. In the past, fire has also played an integral role in maintaining the prairie as a prairie.

Daphne is dotted with mounds known as mima or pimple mounds. There are various theories as to the origin of these two to four feet tall mounds, which are also found on other sites in Texas. One theory is that they could have been created by earthquake activity. Daphne Prairie lies only a few hundred miles to the southwest of the New Madrid seismic zone (NMSZ). During the winter of 1811-1812, a series of earthquakes, the epicenter of which was located near the town of New Madrid, Missouri, occurred along this fault line. The New Madrid earthquakes, the largest in recorded American history and considered by seismologists to be the greatest known release of seismic energy in the world, caused the Mississippi River to run backwards for a short time. The upheaval resulting from these and earlier earthquakes along the NMSZ could have contributed to the formation of the pimple mounds.

The land of Daphne Prairie has changed little in the past 200 years but many of the creatures who lived on this land are gone. Bison once roamed here while vast flocks of the now-extinct **Carolina Parakeet**, the United States' only native parrot species, and **Passenger Pigeon**, believed to be at one time the most numerous birds in the world, filled the skies. A traveler in the area in the 1860s noted that the most abundant resident bird on the prairie was **Attwater's Prairie-Chicken**. Today **Attwater's Prairie-Chicken**, one of three original subspecies of the **Greater Prairie-Chicken**, is the most critically endangered bird in North America. Habitat loss and uncontrolled hunting have taken their toll. Where once a million **Attwater's Prairie-Chickens** roamed six million acres of prairie in Texas and Louisiana, by 2001 there were only about 50 birds living in the wild, all in three southeast Texas counties, and 200 birds in captive breeding programs in Texas. Of the other two subspecies of **Greater Prairie-Chicken**, the **Heath Hen** of the east was hunted to extinction by the 1930s and the northern Great Plains nominate race is on the decline due to habitat loss.

But we had come to see living birds, two elusive and secretive bird species that have historically wintered on the prairie, **Smith's Longspur** and **Sprague's Pipit**. A prairie is a diverse ecosystem. As many as 200 to 300 different kinds of native grasses and wildflowers can be found in an acre of virgin prairie. The original

northeastern Texas prairies with their higher rainfall were dominated by *Silveanus dropseed* and *longspike tridens* as Daphne still is. The golden color of these grasses in winter is echoed by the winter plumage of **Smith's Longspur** and **Sprague's Pipit** and the seeds provide sustenance to the birds during their Texas sojourn.

To get a good look at both Smith's and Sprague's, it is usually necessary to flush them so they will sit up momentarily on a hillock of grass or perhaps in a small bush or tree. Accordingly, 30 eager birders led by Matt White, **Smith's Longspur** expert and author of *The Birds of Northeast Texas*, spread out across the prairie. As we walked, **Sprague's Pipits** and **Savannah Sparrows** flushed in front of us only to fly a short distance and dive back into the grass. The pipits could be distinguished by the habit of Sprague's of calling or singing as they flew up. Finally, it appeared that one Sprague's had decided to light on the ground and stay put or at least stay in one small area. The first challenge for Matt was to get all 30 of his charges in close enough to see the bird without spooking it. It was like the child's game, "Mother, May I?" Matt would say, "Take three steps forward" and the word would be passed down the line. Everyone would move forward and attempt to locate the bird. If you think it's easy to describe the location of a little bird as he moves in and out of depressions and grass clumps which are the same color as the bird, you've never visited a prairie in winter. Eventually, we were all crowded together, some stooping or crouching so as not to block the view of those behind. Miraculously, the bird remained in a very limited area until everyone had the chance to view it. Then Matt moved in to photograph it. You can see the result on the following website:

We were able to see **Smith's Longspurs** in flight but they were too far away for close scrutiny. They retreated to an area across a fence line, thumbing their bills at us. Other good birds seen by some participants were **Grasshopper** and **LeConte's Sparrows**. During the winter **Short-eared Owls** often roost in the trees rimming the prairie but they were absent when we visited.

We applaud B. F. Hicks and his brothers, the owners of the Daphne Prairie, for choosing not only to preserve Daphne in its natural state but also for their decision to restore adjacent pastureland which had until recently been leased out for cattle grazing. With the assistance of Matt White, they are hoping to be able to maintain Daphne through ecotourism. The standard rate for the future for tours of Daphne will be \$50 per person, but the Bird Study Group and guests have been invited to

return at a lower rate in the spring to see the prairie ablaze with wildflowers and to hear the songs of two very special species which breed at Daphne, **Grasshopper Sparrow** and **Bell's Vireo**. The **Carolina Parakeet** and **Passenger Pigeon** are both extinct and will never return but perhaps someday **Attwater's Prairie-Chicken** will rejoin the longspurs, the pipits, the sparrows, and the vireos and once again boom across Daphne Prairie.

Although we had come to the Mount Vernon area primarily to visit Daphne Prairie, we took advantage of some of the multitude of opportunities for birding in the vicinity. Some of us were staying at Selah Inn or in one of the guest cottages at Selah Ranch. Selah Ranch, located a few miles from Mount Vernon and Daphne, is a working ranch where Black Angus cattle are raised without chemicals or hormones. The Inn, an imposing two-story manor house, is built of Austin stone and has ten guest bedrooms. Dave and Candy Hickerson, the owners, had invited the entire group to bird the ranch on Saturday afternoon. There are eight lakes and miles of trails on the ranch and we couldn't begin to do it justice in the three hours we spent birding. We had 40 species, including eight species of sparrow, four species of woodpecker, and **White-breasted Nuthatch**. Many of these we found in the trees and a natural creek area right in front of the house. A **Greater Yellowlegs** surprised us at the pond nearest the house. **Cooper's Hawk**, **American Kestrel**, and **Northern Harrier** were also seen. Dave and Candy provided refreshments for us that included among other items their own special cocoa and spiced tea mixes, myriad varieties of regular and herb teas, crackers, cheeses, grapes, and homemade cookies. We called the afternoon's list in the Inn's large and comfortable living room

On Sunday morning, after we left Daphne, we birded U.S. Highway 167 and a couple of smaller roads. This is an area of wide, open pastures, rolling hills, and ponds or small lakes. **Northern Harriers** coursed over the land as ducks, including **Gadwall**, **American Wigeon**, **Mallard**, **Northern Shoveler**, **Green-winged Teal**, **Ring-necked Duck**, **Lesser** and **Greater Scaup**, **Bufflehead**, **Hooded Merganser**, and **Ruddy Duck** floated on various ponds. When we returned to Mount Vernon, it was beginning to seem like the entire county had rolled out the welcome mat for us as B. F. Hicks and Mayor Richard Mavis and his wife Barbara joined us for lunch at Hubbard's Restaurant. Both the mayor and his wife are birders.

On Sunday afternoon, we divided into two groups to bird Lake Cypress Springs by pontoon boat. The captain

of our boat was Brian Philhower, who owns Tall Tree Marina, Bar and Grill and the boats. Harve Truskett, who had joined us from NETFO, the Longview bird club, was sitting next to Captain Brian in our boat. Since it could be difficult for the captain to hear us over the noise of the motor, when we wanted to get in closer to an area or go in a different direction, we would communicate the request to Harve for him to relay to the captain. Harve, apparently fearing the possible consequences of incurring the wrath of the captain (being hung from the yardarms, forced to walk the plank, or some other similar unpleasantness), would always preface the request with "They want you to do x, y, or z." For this, Harve was subjected not to our wrath but to unmerciful kidding. Methinks Harve's been watching too many pirate movies as Captain Brian readily took us anywhere we wanted to go. Our best birds on Lake Cypress Springs were **Horned Grebe** and **Bald Eagle**.

Several members of the Northeast Louisiana Bird Club were able to stay over an extra day and were treated to a tour of the new nature trail at Mount Vernon's Dupree Park on Monday morning led by B. F. Hicks himself. When we return in May, Mr. Hicks has offered to give a reception for us at the Old Church Inn. The Inn is the old Methodist church which Mr. Hicks saved from destruction and moved to his property because of the role it has played in his family's history. We are also hoping to see some of the collection of bird eggs for which Mt. Vernon has become famous. William Cleveland of Ohio and his son began collecting bird eggs in the 1880's. Cleveland moved to Texas in the 1920s and after he died, his daughter sold the collection of 220 eggs to A. W. Nations. Mr. Nations hoped to establish a natural history museum in Donna, Texas, but the town apparently wasn't interested. After Mr. Nations' death, his son learned from a friend of plans to establish a museum in Mount Vernon and, in 1991, he donated the collection, along with his father's butterfly collection, to the Franklin County Historical Association (FCHA). In the collection are eggs of the extinct **Carolina Parakeet**, **Passenger Pigeon**, and **Heath Hen**. There are only 12 other sets of the **Carolina Parakeet** and 148 sets of the **Passenger Pigeon** eggs known to exist in North American museums today. The FCHA and the town of Mount Vernon are in the process of raising \$25,000 to modify part of the museum so the eggs can be properly cared for and protected. Donations would be gratefully accepted.

### Some Hints on Bird Records

Always give us the bare essentials, the date of the observation, the parish, and the exact location. Be as precise as possible. Remember that "LA 1" gives your wonderful sighting as somewhere along a 350 mile highway! If you remember to say "Caddo Parish, LA 1" you have narrowed it to about 80 miles—still almost useless. Be as exact as possible. Remember also that other birders might want to go to your sighting location. Make it easy for them.

Above all, send in your records. Frequently we discover that a rare bird sighting has never been sent to the BSG database, so we do not have a record for that sighting.

### Submitting Electronic Records

*By Mac Hardy*

Several of you use some form of electronic database system for your bird records. Many of those systems can be easily used to submit records to the BSG database.

BSG database users (PC-File) should select the records to send by the newsletter number (1806 represents the number of this newsletter; vol. 18, number 6; next month will be 1807, etc.). Select the following options: Utilities, Export, New database (.dbf), provide a file name (use your last name; be sure to select the correct drive and folder, as appropriate), ok, yes (flip data is ok), all fields, some records, simple, fill in 1807 in the newslet field, ok if first record showing on the screen is correct select all, ok. Email the .dbf file to lsusmus@prysm.net (it is not necessary to send the .dbh file).

Other users (any .dbf database or product that can export a .dbf database) should select your records by observation date. Select those observations before a date (i.e., Feb. 20, 2004) and after a date (i.e., Jan. 23, 2004). Export them in a .dbf format. Email to lsusmus@prysm.net. NOTE: This is the next best option.

If your system will not support .dbf files, then use any of the formats listed in the BSG Newsletter 18(4).

Otherwise, call me at 797-5338; we can probably determine a way to export your records.

### Christmas Bird Count Quiz Correction

In the last issue, I stated that the Shreveport Christmas Bird Count has had only two different compilers in its history. There have actually been three compilers, Horace Jeter, James R. Stewart (who now lives in Houston), and Charles Lyon. I apologize to Jim Stewart for the omission and thank Horace Jeter for bringing this to my attention.

### Caddo Lake Bird Count

*by Dorothy Metzler*

We counted a total of 107 species on the December 6, Caddo Lake Bird Count, with three new species added to the count list: **Greater White-fronted Goose**, **Merlin**, and **Barn Owl**. Other notable species were **White Ibis** (6), **Osprey** (1), **Bald Eagle** (2), **Purple Finch** (6 - found by three different parties), **Rusty Blackbird** (35), and **Brewer's Blackbird** (1).

All duck numbers were below average, except **Canvasbacks**. Woodpecker numbers were up, with the highest-ever numbers for **Yellow-bellied Sapsucker**, **Hairy Woodpecker**, **Northern Flicker**, **Pileated Woodpecker**; and above-average numbers for **Red-headed**, **Red-bellied** and **Downy Woodpeckers**. (Maybe woodpeckers are just more concentrated this year because there's been so much clear-cutting around Caddo Lake.) **Ring-billed Gull**, **Bonaparte's Gull**, and **Forster's Tern** came in with new high counts. Other high-count species: **Double-crested Cormorant**, **Turkey Vulture**, **Eurasian Collared-Dove**, **Inca Dove**, **Eastern Screech-Owl**, **Blue-headed Vireo**, **Blue-gray Gnatcatcher**, **Ruby-crowned Kinglet**, **Carolina Chickadee**, **Tufted Titmouse**, **Orange-crowned Warbler**, and **Lincoln's Sparrow**.

We had our second highest number ever for **Fish Crows** (74). Incidentally, the Lake O' the Pines count had 59 **Fish Crows** -- a big jump in that population. They first showed up at Lake O' the Pines on the 1995 CBC. I think **Fish Crows** sometimes retreat farther south in cold winters, but clearly did not do so by count time this year.

**MINUTES OF THE BOARD MEETING  
January 6, 2004, 7:15 p.m.  
Museum of Life Sciences at LSUS**

Board members present at the meeting were Mac Hardy, Jeff Trahan, Nancy Menasco, Lily Poole, Larry Raymond, Jerry Bertrand, Amanda Crnkovic, Linda Adrion and Michele Andrews.

**Treasurer's Report** – Jean Trahan was not present. However, Lily Poole distributed her report to each of the board members present at the meeting. She reported income during the last month of \$1,841.75 and expenses of \$1,594.13. The club has \$3,161.97 cash in the bank, \$142.53 at the post office for mailing newsletters, and \$164.73 at the LSUS printing office for printing newsletters. The total assets are then \$3,469.23. One highlight of the report was that the club received \$986.75 as a result of the Christmas auction.



**Old Business** – Lily Poole reported that Dan Weber said that the government hasn't acknowledged that there are **Least Terns** on the Red River. He says that we have to convince them and that we have to get into the process of getting the terns in the recovery plan. Dan is hopeful that this can be done. Lily also said that the club is now on the Time-Warner Channel 12 Community Bulletin Board.

**New Business** – Lily reminded us that the regional science fair is March 6 and that the club gives an award for the best science project pertaining to birds or birding. Amanda Crnkovic evaluated the projects and made the award last year, but cannot do it again this year. Linda Adrion volunteered to take care of the awards this year. Lily also said that Dennis Forshee has agreed to be a board member, however this must be voted on by the membership of the club.

**Donations** – Nancy Menasco reported that some money has been donated to the club specifically for refuges. Nancy moved that if the club receives donations for refuges, that the club will contribute it to the Baton Rouge Audubon Society (BRAS) specifically for the new wildlife refuges that BRAS is attempting to acquire on the Louisiana coast. This property is composed of two tracts that contain the same coastal woodland habitat critical for migrating birds as Peveto Woods. The motion passed.

**Bird Records** – Mac Hardy said that he wants to show club members how to enter data into the database at the next meeting.

**Newsletter** – Amanda Crnkovic asked about how to collect charges for ads in the newsletter. The board decided that the treasurer should send an invoice.

**Beginning Birders** – Lily said that Dennis Forshee will take on the beginning birder committee when he is a board member. Larry Raymond reported that Walter B. Jacobs Nature Park will be doing many beginning birder programs in the near future.

**Field Trips** – Nancy Menasco reported on future field trips. Mac Hardy will lead the trip to the Eugene Smith Tract of the Red River Wildlife Refuge on January 17. The Louisiana Ornithological Society meeting in Monroe is at the end of January. The Great Backyard Bird Count will take place from February 13 through February 16. Lily and Nancy suggested that we have a get together on Saturday or Sunday of that weekend. Also, the club will have a trip to Indian Creek near

Alexandria to see **Red-cockaded Woodpeckers** and **Bachman's Sparrows**.

**Library** – Linda Adrion and the board discussed the state of the library. The board decided that we should use the Dewey Decimal System, that we need a list of books present in the library, and that ownership plates should be placed in each of the books. Nancy Menasco moved that the club purchase the Birds of North America software for the museum library. The motion passed.

**BIRD REPORT** – *compiled January 23, 2004*

Use the bird report to see what other birders have been seeing and where to go find the bird you want to see. Observers are abbreviated by the first and last initials. Dates and localities of observations are summarized under the observer's initials. Sightings are arranged by species. Following each species is a line of data in the following format: date, initials of the observer, number of birds observed, initials of another observer, number of birds they observed, etc. For the number of birds observed, a 1 is used for both 1 bird and for numbers not reported by the observer. For example: 01/12/99 BB 2 means that on January 12, 1999, BB saw two birds. Then by looking on the observer list, located after the sightings, you can determine that BB is Bob Birder and on 1/12/99 he was birding C. Bickham Dickson Park.

Report bird records for the newsletter to Mac Hardy by the 15<sup>th</sup> of each month. All bird records reported here are observations of the observers and are therefore the responsibility of the observer.
