Next Meeting-March 9, 2004 Hot Pink Birds, Pink Dolphins, & Frogs with Red Feet by Amanda Crnkovic

MARCH PROGRAM

When: Tuesday, March 9, 6:30 p.m.

Where: LSU-Shreveport, Museum of Life Sciences

Bird Study Group member, Amanda Crnkovic, will present a program describing her trip to Brazil. Amanda traveled to Brazil in June of 2003 with Mac Hardy, also a BSG member, to attend professional meetings. The trip included 3-day excursions to both the Aldophe Ducke Ecological Reserve and to the Anavilhanas Ecological Reserve. Researchers from the two reserves guided them in an exploration of the Amazon rainforest and the Rio Negro. During these excursions they birded at every opportunity and captured, photographed, and released amphibians and reptiles.

Come hear the stories of a field biologist's first trip to the Amazon rainforest, see photos of the spectacular birds and other wildlife, and experience Brazil off the beaten track and on the muddy trail.

Amanda received a Bachelor of Science in Biology from LSUS in May of 2000 and a Master of Science in Biology from LSU-Health Sciences Center in August of 2003. Amanda is a Herpetologist (someone who studies reptiles and amphibians), but is interested in biodiversity including birds and mammals. Amanda is currently the Collections Manager of the Museum of Life Sciences and is currently teaching General Zoology at LSUS. She is also the editor of the BSG newsletter.

UPCOMING FIELD TRIPS AND EVENTS

Membership in the BSG is encouraged but not required for participation in field trips. Beginning birders are welcome on all field trips.

IMPORTANT NOTICE: Field trips will **LEAVE** the designated meeting place at the time posted for each field trip. Plan to arrive early for field trip orientation and carpooling/caravanning arrangements, if necessary.

INDIAN CREEK RECREATION AREA, WOODWORTH, LA

Saturday, March 13, 2004, 7:00 a.m.

Meet at the LSUS Museum of Life Sciences. Indian Creek Recreation Area is located south of Alexandria in the Alexander State Forest in Rapides Parish and includes the 2,250-acre Indian Creek Lake. Target birds include **Red-cockaded Woodpecker** and **Bachman's Sparrow**. Plan on moderate walking on the 2½-milelong Indian Creek Nature Trail. The trail winds through a mixed pine-hardwood forest and "traverses uplands and minor stream bottoms, providing access to a variety of habitats supporting numerous plant and animal species." If you are not up to walking the trail, there are paved roads throughout the area and a number of sites where you can just sit and wait for the birds to come to you. Restrooms are located onsite. There is an entrance fee of \$3.00 per vehicle. We will lunch at Lea's

Restaurant in Lecompte and then spend a couple of hours birding by car looking for **Sandhill Cranes** and other area birds. We will be back in Shreveport by dark but participants may leave the field trip whenever they wish. What to bring: \$3.00 per car admission fee, snacks, drinks, two-way radios, scope.

BISHOP POINT AND SMITHPORT LAKE DAM

Meet at the LSUS Museum of Life Sciences. The Bishop Point area, located just north of Lock and Dam No. 5 on the Caddo side, is one of our newest Hot Spots. The habitat includes grassland, cattail marshes, ponds, woods, and the Red River. Most areas can be viewed from the road between the dam and Bishop Point. From Bishop Point, we will continue on to Smithport Lake and Smithport Lake Dam to look for Northern Parulas and other early migrants. Last year's March 23 field trip to these areas turned up 73 species, including five wren species. Plan on some light walking. Bishop Point has Port-o-lets. Restrooms at the dam may or may not be available. What to bring: snacks, drinks, two-way radios, scope, and a lunch, or plan to pick up a burger or sandwich at the Martins' store, which is located on LA 1 at the turn to Lock and Dam No. 5 and Bishop Point.

EDDIE D. JONES NATURE PARK

Meet at the LSUS Museum of Life Sciences. Another of our new Hot Spots, Eddie Jones is managed as an adventure park and has over 15 miles of trails for hiking, mountain biking, and horseback riding. Habitat ranges from open field to edge of forest, second growth and mature forest. There are large expanses of switch cane, two ponds, and a couple of large creeks. Park specialties include **Wild Turkey**, **Northern Bobwhite**, **Sedge** and **Marsh Wrens**, **Louisiana Waterthrush**, and **Blue Grosbeak**. Expect a probable mix of resident species, late winter birds and early migrants. There are restrooms available at the park headquarters area. What to bring: drinks and snacks, insect repellant.

Members of the Northwest Chapter of the Louisiana Native Plant Society will join the group at the park's visitor center at 10:00 a.m. to start a plant field trip. Come prepared for moderate walking on steep terrain to see some of the floral jewels of the park. Bring a sack lunch and enjoy a picnic on the grounds after the hike.

NOAH TYSON PARK ON BLACK BAYOU LAKE

Meet at the Whataburger Restaurant, 2900 N. Market. The park is almost surrounded by water with many tall pine trees, sweetgums, and oak trees in the center of the park and cypress and water tupelo swamp on three sides. Target species include warblers, vireos, and nesting Red-shouldered Hawks. The park has restrooms, picnic tables, and barbecue grills. Expect light walking. What to bring: drinks, snacks, lunch, and insect repellant.

LOS SPRING MEETING, CAMERON, LA


Friday, April 23 - Sunday, April 25, 2004

Instructions for BSG Trip Leaders

Field trip leaders are needed for future BSG field trips, including the summer and fall of 2004. Please consider volunteering to lead a trip. You may choose your location and date, if you like. You do not have to be an expert birder to lead a field trip; there is almost always at least one experienced birder on all field trips that can assist in identifications. If not, participants will have an excellent opportunity to learn the process of bird identification, from noting field marks to narrowing down the possibilities. Here are some guidelines for trip leaders.

Before the trip:

• Scout location ahead of time. If birding away from home, enlist the assistance of local birders if possible.

- Contact private landowners to confirm date and time of expected entry.
- Establish a rainy day policy and alternate date when possible.

Day of field trip:

- Arrive early at the meeting place.
- Greet participants as they arrive. Make sure everyone is introduced.
- Briefly outline the field trip agenda including destination, target species, rest stops, physical requirements, and ending time. Determine if anyone has any special needs or interests that can be accommodated.
- Distribute checklists.
- If caravanning to field trip location, organize the vehicles into carpools. To ensure that no one gets left behind, distribute FRS 2-way radios to the lead and last vehicles along with fresh batteries, if necessary. Verify that radios work and are on the same channel and subchannel. If birding by car, try to equip all vehicles with radios so that stops and bird sightings may be communicated to all participants. Remind drivers that each vehicle in the caravan is responsible for keeping the vehicle behind him or her in sight.
- Leave on time.
- Drive the speed limit or slower. Communicate turns ahead of time by radio and use your turn signals!
- Make sure all stops are in safe locations.
- Attempt to include rest stops at reasonable intervals.
- Don't trespass on private land.

At field trip location:

- Spend a few minutes orienting group.
- Identify beginning birders who may need extra assistance.
- Encourage quiet participation for the enjoyment of all. Remind participants of birding etiquette avoid sudden or loud noises, unnecessary talking and gesturing, walking in front of the leader, etc.
- Encourage all participants to report sightings or vocalizations.
- Ask an experienced birder to take up the rear so that those furthest from the leader will have someone to assist them. If group is large, consider dividing into two groups.
- Assist all trip participants in locating all birds.
- Call the list during breaks and at the end of the trip.

After the field trip:

• Turn in the official checklist to the BSG database.

• Write an account of the trip for the next BSG Newsletter or ask a trip participant to do so.

Parish Year List Competition

In January of this year, David Muth of New Orleans proposed a friendly Parish Year List Competition, which would have "the added advantage of generating some useful information about bird distribution in the state." Here are the guidelines as David described them:

"The goal will be to see as many species as possible in a given parish. Anyone can enter for any parish and for any number of parishes. A winner will be declared for each parish.

In addition, the total statewide parish lister will be a winner. In other words, we will add up the cumulative total of individual parish lists to get an overall winner. If you get 200 species in one parish, 100 in another, 50 in two others, and 25 in five others, then your total parish list for the year would be:

200+100+50+50+25+25+25+25+25=525.

Honor system applies, but any bird on the LBRC Review List must be submitted to the committee in order to be countable. Submitted – we won't wait for the deliberations of the committee.

You don't need to announce your entry, though if you want to e-mail me (dmuth@bellsouth.net) and let me know you are in, I'll be pleased to hear from you."

Judith O'Neale immediately jumped on the bandwagon and committed the Louisiana Ornithological Society (LOS) to providing prizes for the parish and overall winners. BSG member Rosemary Seidler volunteered to compile the list of all species sighted by parish during the year 2004.

Our own Hubert Hervey suggested that we sweeten the pot for Bird Study Group members by supplementing the prizes to be awarded by the LOS. The BSG Board of Directors approved the idea and the membership voted at the February meeting that the BSG will provide \$25 prizes for the BSG members who report the highest total number of species in each of the parishes covered by the BSG database. These parishes are Bienville, Bossier, Caddo, Claiborne, DeSoto, Natchitoches, Red River, and Webster. In addition, the BSG member with the highest combined total in the eight-parish area will receive a \$50 prize. Note that this is not the total number of different species for all eight parishes, but the total number of species seen in each parish added together (see example above in David Muth's guidelines). In order to qualify for the BSG prizes, participants must submit their records to the BSG database.

Submit your sightings monthly, if possible, to the BSG database. See page 10 of the December 2003 BSG newsletter at

for the information required for each sighting and the various ways you can submit your records or call Mac Hardy at 797-5338. You may submit your species list by parish to Rosemary at rseidler@centenary.edu (species only, not numbers of birds). Rosemary has created an Excel spreadsheet you may use to track your species count by parish. Download the spreadsheet at http://www.softdisk.com/comp/birds/SelectCheck.html. Deadline for final submission to the BSG competition of your species count for each of the eight BSG parishes will be announced in a future newsletter.

MINUTES OF THE BOARD MEETING February, 2004 Virtual Board Meeting

The BSG Board conducted its first "virtual" board meeting. This meeting was conducted via email and monitored by the club president Lily Poole. Lily sent the agenda to all board members January 30. The meeting concluded February 6.

Board members participating in the meeting were Lily Poole, Jerry Bertrand, Jeff Trahan, Jean Trahan, Linda Adrion, Michele Andrews, Amanda Crnkovic, Mac Hardy, Hubert Hervey, Nancy Menasco, Larry Raymond, Dan Weber, and Dennis Forshee. Committee chairpersons and others participating were Rosemary Seidler, Barney Poole, and Jim Ingold.

Treasurer's Report – Jean Trahan reported that for the month ending January 31, 2004, the club had \$2,853.38 in the bank. In addition we had \$312.66 and \$264.73 in prepaid expenses at the post office and LSUS printing, respectively. The fund balance is \$3,430.77. Net income for the month of January was \$97.00, and expenses were \$235.46.

Important Bird Areas – Hubert Hervey chairs the BSG IBA committee. Other committee members are Mac Hardy, Jim Ingold, Paul Dickson, and Jeff Trahan. Hubert said that Louisiana has no recognized Important Bird Areas (IBA). He intends to submit the Red River Valley; from Alexandria to the Arkansas line as an IBA. Hubert said that he has lost the application form, but will obtain another copy.

LOS Contest - Hubert Hervey reported that David Muth from New Orleans has proposed a competition supported

by the Louisiana Ornithological Society (LOS) to see who can see the most species of birds in each Louisiana parish in 2004. Hubert suggested that the BSG participate and supplement the awards for the BSG area parishes. After some discussion via email, the final motion was "The BSG will participate in the LOS contest for 2004 by providing an award to the person who turns in to the BSG database the high count of bird species for each of the eight parishes in our area. The BSG will also provide an award of two times the individual parish award for the high count of bird species in all eight parishes totaled. These parishes include Bienville, Bossier, Caddo, Claiborne, DeSoto, Red River, Webster, and all of Natchitoches Parish. This award will be set at \$25 per parish, plus \$50 to the overall winner thereby totaling a payment of \$250. The type of award, whether cash, store certificate or other value, would be set by the BSG board. All review list species must have documentation sent to the LOS to be counted in this competition." The motion was seconded and passed by the board. Because the amount to be awarded as prizes is greater than \$100, this motion must be approved by the general membership at the February meeting.

Library – A motion was made to purchase the DVD "Watching Sparrows" for the library. The treasurer said that the only money specifically designated for library expenditures is the June Haynie Memorial Fund, which has a balance of \$137.05. The motion passed.

Hot Spots – Larry Raymond reported that he is almost ready to assemble the review team for the second edition of "Birding Hot Spots." Once the review team has made their corrections and we are ready to go to print, the board will have to decide how many copies to print and whether or not to send some to ABA.

Fund Raising – Jerry Bertrand reported that he would like help building a few birdhouses and/or feeders and has asked for more donations. He said that we had a pretty pitiful auction last month. Also, if anyone knows a source of birdhouse material, please let him know as his lumber supply is getting rather thin.

Monroe Bird Club Challenge – Nancy Menasco reported that Gerry Click of the Northeast Louisiana Bird Club (Monroe) told us during LOS winter meeting that the Monroe club would like to challenge us to a one-day birding competition. A day would be chosen during spring migration during which each club's members would bird their home parish area. That would be Caddo Parish for the BSG and Ouachita Parish for the

Monroe club. The club with the most species wins North Louisiana bragging rights. A motion was made to accept the challenge and to share the cost of a trophy or plaque. The trophy or plaque would be passed to the winning club each year. The motion passed.

Field Trips —Nancy Menasco reported on future fieldtrips. They are: 1) Bishop Point/Smithport Lake on Saturday, March 27, 2) Eddie Jones Park field trip in April. Larry Raymond will be the leader. 3) NE Bird Club Challenge. This is tentative and the date is not yet set. 4) LOS Spring Meeting, Cameron, Louisiana, Friday, April 23-Sunday, April 25. 5) Fort Hood, Texas to see Black-caped Vireos, May 1 and 2. Nancy also reported on additional field trips in May and June. She also said that she needs volunteers to lead field trips, especially to local Hot Spots, and has asked for suggestions for future field trips.

Miscellaneous – Rosemary Seidler reported that there are 56 members on the Bird Alert. Lily Poole welcomed Dennis Forshee to the board as chair of the Beginning Birders committee. Lily also reported that we have 93 paid accounts. Michelle Andrews has sent our February meeting information to the Shreveport newspaper. Barney Poole reported that the 2003 NW Louisiana checklist is posted on the web site.

Minutes of the Regular Meeting February 10, 2004, 7:00 p.m., Museum of Life Sciences at LSUS

Program – David Cimprich presented the program on the endangered **Black-capped Vireo**. David has worked for the Nature Conservancy's Fort Hood Project in central Texas for the past 2½ years. He oversees the monitoring of the large population of **Black-capped Vireos** on the installation.

LOS Competition – Hubert Hervey reported that David Muth from New Orleans has proposed a competition supported by the Louisiana Ornithological Society (LOS) to see who can see the most species of birds in a Louisiana parish in 2004. Hubert suggested that the BSG can participate and augment the award. Hubert made the following motion: "The BSG will participate in the LOS contest for 2004 by providing an award to the person who turns in to the BSG database the high count of bird species for each of the eight parishes in our area. The BSG will provide an award of two times the individual parish award for the high count of bird species in all eight parishes totaled. These parishes include Bienville, Bossier, Caddo, Claiborne, DeSoto,

Red River, Webster, and all of Natchitoches Parish. This award will be set at \$25 per parish, thereby totaling a payment of \$250. The type of award, whether cash, store certificate or other value, would be set by the BSG board. All review list species must have documentation sent to the LOS to be counted in this competition." The motion was seconded and passed by the membership present at the meeting.

Treasurer's Report –Jean Trahan gave the treasurer's report for the month ending January 31, 2004. She said the club had \$2,853.38 in the bank. In addition we had \$312.66 and \$264.73 in prepaid expenses at the post office and LSUS printing, respectively. The fund balance is \$3,430.77. Net income for the month of January was \$97.00 and expenses were \$235.46.

Field Trips – Lily Poole reported that Bodcau Wildlife Management Area will have a weekend seminar on March 27-28 to train individuals in wildlife Nancy Menasco said that the Great rehabilitation. Backyard Bird Count will take place this weekend. She said that the club will strive to make Shreveport the Louisiana city with the highest species count. A brunch is planned for Sunday at 10:30 a.m. at Amanda Crnkovic's house for the purpose of making plans for the remainder of the count. Nancy said that a field trip to Bishop Point and Smithport Lake is planned for March 27. Also, the Northeast Louisiana Bird Club has challenged the BSG to a one-day birding contest to see which club can observe the most species of birds in one parish. This would be Caddo Parish for the BSG. There would be a trophy that would be passed to the winning club. This contest will take place the same day as the North American Migration Count that will take place on May 8 this year. Nancy reported that there will be an out-of-town field trip to Fort Hood, Texas, to see the **Black-capped Vireos** on May 1 and 2.

Miscellaneous – Hubert Hervey reported that he had Paul Dickson's records for the BCBCBC. The data from these Christmas Counts include years before and after the installation of the lock and dam system on the Red River. He would like someone to work with the data to determine how this significant change in the river habitat has affected the avifauna. Amanda Crnkovic reported that Nan Franks has offered to coordinate the folding and mailing of the newsletter. Rosemary Seidler said that there are 56 members on the Bird Alert service. Linda Adrion said that the club's library will order "Watching Sparrows" in DVD format. Larry Raymond reported that the Hot Spots publication will be ready within one month.

Bird Talk – Hubert Hervey said that he attended Eagle Fest in Emory, Texas. Hubert said that this is supposed to be the eagle capital of Texas. He saw no eagles; however, he did see two Crested Caracaras. Jim Ingold reported on the bird banding at Paul Dickson's farm. He said that four species were banded. Those included Song Sparrow, Swamp Sparrow, Northern Cardinal, and White-crowned Sparrow. Those attending the bird banding saw a total of thirty species. Rosemary Seidler reported that Bobbe Womack has an Allen's Hummingbird at her house.

BIRD REPORT – compiled March 24, 2004

Use the bird report to see what other birders have been seeing and where to go find the bird you want to see. Observers are abbreviated by the first and last initials. Dates and localities of observations are summarized under the observer's initials. Sightings are arranged by species. Following each species is a line of data in the following format: date, initials of the observer, number of birds observed, initials of another observer, number of birds they observed, etc. For the number of birds observed, a 1 is used for both 1 bird and for numbers not reported by the observer. For example: 01/12/99 BB 2 means that on January 12, 1999, BB saw two birds. Then by looking on the observer list, located after the sightings, you can determine that BB is Bob Birder and on 1/12/99 he was birding C. Bickham Dickson Park.

Report bird records for the newsletter to Mac Hardy by the 15th of each month. All bird records reported here are observations of the observers and are therefore the responsibility of the observer.
