## **Next Meeting-October 12, 2004** **The Red River National Wildlife Refuge:** **Overview, Current Status, and Future Management** *by Brett Hunter*

### **OCTOBER PROGRAM**

**Where:** LSU in Shreveport, Museum of Life Sciences

Brett Hunter, the Red River NWR Refuge Manager, will present this month's program. The talk will include an overview of the Red River National Wildlife Refuge, its current status, and future management, with emphasis on habitat restoration in the Red River Valley and the associated benefits to wildlife. Brett has a Bachelor of Science degree in Wildlife and Fisheries Management from the University of Tennessee and a Master of Science degree in Wildlife Biology from Louisiana State University. He has been with the U. S. Fish and Wildlife Service since 1998 and has been the refuge manager for the newly established Red River NWR since January of 2004.

**CADDO LAKE NATIONAL WILDLIFE REFUGE AND CADDO LAKE BOAT TOUR**

This will be a joint field trip of the BSG and NETFO (Northeast Texas Field Ornithologists). Meet at the LSUS Museum of Life Sciences to caravan to the Caddo Lake National Wildlife Refuge (formerly Longhorn Army Ammunition Plant) at Karnack, Texas. One of the highest quality old-growth bottomland hardwood forests in the southeastern United States lies within the refuge along Harrison Bayou. The wetlands located along the shores of Caddo Lake are listed as a “Wetland of International Significance” under the Ramsar Convention on Wetlands and is one of only 19 such designated areas in the United States.

Lunch will be at Dawn’s Caddo Crossing. The menu includes catfish, chicken, chicken-fried steak, and sandwiches. **Dawn’s does not accept credit cards, so be sure and bring cash or a check for lunch.** After lunch we will board the paddlewheel steamboat, *The Graceful Ghost*, for a narrated tour of Caddo Lake. There are restroom facilities on board and you may bring snacks and drinks if you wish. The group rate per person for the boat tour is \$12 (nongroup rate is \$15). In order for us to get the group rate, we need a minimum of 12 participants. You may pay at the dock. Cash, check, MasterCard, Visa, and Discover are accepted.

Join us for all or any part of the field trip. Expect some walking. If you are only joining us for lunch and the steamboat tour, be at Dawn’s about 12:15 p.m. If you are only doing the steamboat tour, be at the steamboat landing at 2:30 p.m. **Reservations are required for lunch and the steamboat tour but not for the Caddo Lake NWR. RSVP to Nancy Menasco by October 13.**

*C. Bickham Dickson Park (Red River Education and Research Park)*

The 12<sup>th</sup> Annual Big Sit officially begins at midnight and ends 24 hours later. The Big Sit was founded by the New Haven, CT, Bird Club and is hosted by Birdwatcher’s Digest. Participants count from within a 17-foot diameter circle. Swarovski Optik donates \$500 to the team who gets the "Golden Bird," a bird selected by random drawing from all birds sighted. The winning circle chooses a non-profit environmental-based organization to be the recipient of the \$500. This will be the fourth BSG Big Sit at C. Bickham Dickson Park. Last year, our count total was 70 species, up from 68 species in 2002 and 53 in 2001.

Sitters may come and go at will. Beginning birders are especially encouraged to participate in this event. This is an excellent opportunity to observe patterns of

What to bring: binoculars, scope, mosquito repellent, drinks, snacks, money for lunch and the boat tour.

## Rarities on the Red River – The BSG Expedition of 2004

On Sunday, August 29, 2004, 23 birders boarded five boats at Bishop Point near Lock and Dam No. 5 for the Bird Study Group's annual Red River Expedition. You never know what you might see on the Red River but no one would have predicted the surprise of this year's expedition, an adult **Sabine's Gull** in alternate (breeding) plumage, identified by Charlie Lyon. The gull, first observed flying south over the sandbar nearest Bishop Point by the birders in two of our boats, was briefly seen again just north of the lock and dam and then was seen no more. **Sabine's Gull**, a high Arctic breeder, is a small hooded gull the size of a **Bonaparte's Gull**, but its bold black-and-white wing pattern is unique. There are only a handful of records of **Sabine's Gull** in Louisiana and all previous northwestern Louisiana sightings are September records of immature birds. Two birds were observed at Lock and Dam No. 4 in Red River Parish over a period of several days in 1998 and Charlie Lyon has two records of single birds on Cross Lake, one in 2001 and one in 2003. To our knowledge, the Bird Study Group's sighting is the first record of an adult **Sabine's Gull** in Louisiana.

Two **Black-bellied Whistling-Ducks** were hiding in the grass at the second sandbar north of Bishop Point. Jerry Bertrand and I had found two ducks at this location in late May of this year. Daily rains kept us off the river in June, however, we found two again in July and have observed one or two here regularly throughout the summer. **Black-Bellied Whistling-Ducks** are usually cavity nesters, but, according to *The Birder's Handbook*, they also nest on the ground "among rushes, weeds, or grass along lake margin." This is a good description of the habitat on this sandbar, with the back side being much like the shore of a lake. **Black-bellied Whistling-Ducks** have expanded their breeding range north from Mexico into Texas and Oklahoma. No ducklings have made their appearance here yet, but it's possible there could have been an unsuccessful nesting attempt and we may see them in the not too distant future.

Also discovered at this sandbar was a **Willet**, a fairly rare migrant in northwestern Louisiana albeit the second bird seen at this location this summer, and over 200 **Caspian Terns**. The first wintering ducks to arrive in our area are the **Blue-winged Teal** and there were at least 150 present. Other birds here included **American White Pelican**, **Tricolored Heron**, **Black-necked Stilt**, **Greater Yellowlegs**, **Lesser Yellowlegs**, **Spotted Sandpiper**, and **Long-billed Dowitcher** along with the usual herons and egrets. Farther upriver several **Black**

**Terns** and two **White Ibis** flew over us and we found a flock of over 200 migrating **Eastern Kingbirds** in the trees on an island near Clark's Marina. Just after sunset, we watched as four **Black-crowned Night-Herons** came in to do a little night fishing from snags in a backwater area just northeast of the dam.

### Bird Watchers Needed for Project FeederWatch

Last February you helped scientists create a snapshot view of the abundance and distribution of North American birds by participating in the Great Backyard Bird Count (GBBC). Thank you! We hope you've had a chance to review the results you helped create.

Did you know that you can provide that same kind of information to scientists throughout the winter? When you consider the difference you made during one weekend in February, imagine what your observations can tell scientists over an entire winter when you become part of Project FeederWatch.

Like the GBBC, Project FeederWatch relies upon volunteers to help scientists learn about bird populations. We need you to help gather data in the coming months about the birds that visit your feeders throughout the winter. If you are already a Project FeederWatch participant, thank you for contributing to the success of the project! If you are not a FeederWatch participant, but enjoy feeding birds, please read on.

FeederWatch participants count the birds at their feeders as often as every week from November through early April. Participants then submit counts over the Internet. We invite you to contribute to our understanding of winter bird populations by joining nearly 16,000 fellow bird watchers in Project FeederWatch.

### Why is FeederWatch Important?

FeederWatch data provide a detailed picture of weekly changes in the distribution and abundance of birds across the continent. Long-term monitoring programs, such as FeederWatch, are important for identifying changes in bird populations and for targeting research and conservation efforts. FeederWatch data are currently being analyzed to gauge the impact of wild fires and West Nile virus on wild birds. Please help monitor the health of winter bird populations by joining us in the 18th season of Project FeederWatch. You can learn more about the project at <http://www.birds.cornell.edu/pfw>, where you can see maps, trend graphs, and other results generated from FeederWatch data.

### What do you receive for participating?

FeederWatchers receive a research kit that includes: the FeederWatch Handbook, our guide to feeding birds; a full-color identification poster of common feeder birds (painted by renowned bird artist Larry McQueen); a calendar featuring photographs taken by FeederWatch participants; instructions on how to participate; and access to our online data entry system. In addition, U.S. participants receive a subscription to BirdScope (the newsletter of the Cornell Lab of Ornithology), and Canadian participants receive a subscription to BirdWatch Canada (the newsletter of Bird Studies Canada). Canadian participants are also eligible to participate for no additional cost in other bird monitoring programs including Christmas Bird Counts, the Canadian Lakes Loon Survey, Owl Surveys, and more.

### How do you join?

Just sign up! A \$15 annual participation fee (\$12 for members of the Lab of Ornithology) helps cover your materials and newsletter subscription, staff support, web site support, and data analysis. If you are currently participating in FeederWatch, thank you! Please do not renew your participation until we send you a renewal notice.

**MINUTES OF THE BOARD MEETING**

September 7, 2004

**Treasurer's Report** – Jeff Trahan gave the treasurer's report for Jean Trahan who could not be present at this meeting. For the month ending June 30, the club had \$2,914.04 in the bank. In addition we had \$149.60 and \$133.60 in prepaid expenses at the post office and LSUS printing, respectively. The fund balance is \$3,197.24.

**Old Business** – Lily Poole will announce at the next meeting a request for nominations for the President's award and the lifetime Service award. A motion was made to set the wholesale price for the Hot Spots publication at \$4.00 and that the board will consider for approval organizations that will receive this wholesale price. This motion was approved. A motion was made to approve The American Birding Association (ABA) and the Wild Bird Center in Shreveport as wholesalers. This motion was also approved.

**New Business** – Jim Ingold (who was not present at this meeting) has asked that the club to purchase a "Sky Pointer." This is a green laser that can be used on field trips to point out birds in trees. The price of the pointer and shipping is \$155.00. It is warranted against defects for six months. Jim will purchase one for his personal use and we will be able to test it to see how functional it would be. Rosemary Seidler has suggested that we shorten the monthly meeting and has provided a suggested agenda for regular meetings. The board will examine the agenda and discuss it at the next meeting. Nancy Menasco has asked that the treasurer develop a proposed budget to be presented to the board at the next board meeting.

**Bird Records** – Mac Hardy said that he receives about twenty pages of bird records to enter into the data base each month and that this is very time consuming for him. A suggestion was made that we can pay someone to enter the records. Mac moved that the club hire a worker to enter the data as required for two months. In the meantime, we will look for other ways to enter the data such as online through the internet, or teaching others to use the database.

**Field Trips** – Nancy Menasco reported that the Big Sit will take place October 10 at Bickham Dickson Park. Nancy asked for suggestions for field trips for October. She proposed a Caddo Lake steamboat trip. Rhonda Clay agreed to lead a field trip at Walter B. Jacobs Park in October.

**Fund Raising** – Jerry Bertrand says he needs help making bird houses.

**Christmas Party** – Hubert Hervey reminded everyone of the Christmas party in December. Hubert said that he would wear his Santa Claus hat and will give door prizes.

**Membership** – Lily Poole reported 98 paid accounts.

**Programs** – Larry Raymond and Mac Hardy will make a presentation about their trip to Uganda at the September meeting.

**Web Site** – Lily Poole reported that Barney Poole recommends Globat.com as a host provider for the bird club web pages. The annual price would be \$90.00. Nancy Menasco moved that we accept Barney's recommendation and use Globat.com as the host provider. The motion was approved.

## BIRD REPORT – compiled September 27, 2004

Use the bird report to see what other birders have been seeing and where to go find the bird you want to see. Observers are abbreviated by the first and last initials. Dates and localities of observations are summarized under the observer's initials. Sightings are arranged by species. Following each species is a line of data in the following format: date, initials of the observer, number of birds observed, initials of another observer, number of birds they observed, etc. For the number of birds observed, a 1 is used for both 1 bird and for numbers not reported by the observer. For example: 01/12/99 BB 2 means that on January 12, 1999, BB saw two birds. Then by looking on the observer list, located after the sightings, you can determine that BB is Bob Birder and on 1/12/99 he was birding C. Bickham Dickson Park.

Report bird records for the newsletter to Mac Hardy by the 15<sup>th</sup> of each month. All bird records reported here are observations of the observers and are therefore the responsibility of the observer.

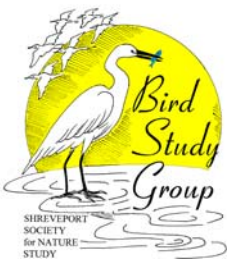
