301-Year-Old Birdhouse to be Auctioned

Jim Delahoussaye has generously provided another birdhouse for our auction this year. The certificate accompanying this birdhouse reads as follows: “The 301-year-old birdhouse comes by its provenance this way. The tree that it came from was originally harvested in the Atchafalaya Basin sometime in the late 1800s. While no one cored this tree to establish its age, I am assured that virtually all of those huge trees were at least 200 years old. The barn that was built from this tree was situated on Bayou Grosse Tete, just outside the Basin,

and was built in the early part of the last century, exact date unknown. The structure became unstable and was salvaged for lumber by Mr. Gene Seneca in 2002. Mr. Seneca donated some of the old, reclaimed lumber to me with the words “Just make it come alive again”. What better way to do that and keep the romance of the old wood going than to make things that have a forest theme, hence the birdhouses. So, 200 years as a tree, 100 years as a barn, and 1 as a birdhouse – 301 years old. I am glad you have number 68, and may you have many years of enjoyment with its use.”

In 2004 the birdhouse is 302 years old. Look for this treasure on the Christmas auction block.

Winky and the Birders

The Bird Study Group field trip to Walter B. Jacobs Memorial Nature Park on Saturday, November 13, 2004, ranks as one of the more unusual, not because of the destination, but because it is probably the first BSG field trip to be led by a bird. A **Barred Owl** named Winky shared the trip's leadership with his best friend, park naturalist and BSG member, Rhonda Clay. Winky came to Jacobs Nature Park as a youngster to recuperate from injuries received when he was accidentally hit by a car. The loss of one eye precluded his return to the wild, so now Rhonda and he collaborate in presenting programs to educate the public and foster appreciation of owls. Winky is the star attraction at the park on weekends and has visited a Bird Study Group meeting. Rhonda and Winky regularly take long walks on the park's trails and Winky has his favorite places where he likes to sit and commune. An assortment of birds comes to check him out, but he ignores most of them. Rhonda told us Winky doesn't like **Blue Jays** but he's not afraid of them; however, there is an area of the park where **American Crows** nest each year and Winky is uncomfortable passing through that area. A murder of crows may be just that and can pose a serious threat to owls, with the possible exception of the larger owls like the **Great Horned Owl**.

Although the woods on the Saturday of our field trip were fairly quiet, two **Red-breasted Nuthatches** were seen, one in the woods by Rhonda and Winky, and one in the trees along the main road not far from the pavilion. This was a life bird for several of us. It was a three-nuthatch day as Mark Wilson and Jerry Bertrand found a **Brown-headed Nuthatch** and the rest of us saw a **White-breasted Nuthatch**. Sparrows were surprisingly absent except for a few **White-throated Sparrows** and one **Song Sparrow**. Some of the birds that Winky attracted were **Blue-headed Vireo**, **Carolina Chickadee**, **Tufted Titmouse**, **Carolina Wren**, **Ruby-crowned Kinglet**, **Pine Warbler**, and two **Brown Creepers**. Winky is truly a magnificent bird and we felt privileged to be birding with him and Rhonda.

After lunch at the Longwood General Store, six of us decided to go to Ford Park in the hope of finding the **Western Tanager** seen earlier in the day by Charlie Lyon and Kreg Ellzey. We had no luck on the tanager, but we did have some other nice birds, among them a **Belted Kingfisher** fishing the pond, and a number of birds working the trees near the pond, including many **Pine Warblers**, **Red-bellied Woodpecker**, **Yellow-bellied Sapsucker**, **Downy Woodpecker**, **Eastern Phoebe**, and **Yellow-rumped Warblers**. Two species

not seen earlier at Walter B. Jacobs were **Chipping Sparrow** and our first **Dark-eyed Juncos** of the season.

Southeastern Caddo Parish Birding

Seven members of the Bird Study Group spent Sunday, November 28, 2004, combing southeastern Caddo Parish for sparrows, hawks, sparrow hawks, and any other birds we could find. By the end of the outing, we had a total of 62 species, including nine species of sparrows, six species of raptor, and two species of big, black birds. Robson Road between LA 1 and Ellerbe Road yielded **Chipping Sparrows**, **White-throated Sparrows**, and **White-crowned Sparrows** in the trees and bushes along a farm drainage ditch; **Vesper Sparrows** and **Savannah Sparrows** sitting on fences and utility wires beside a field where **Eastern Meadowlarks** sang; and **Dark-eyed Juncos** on the ground under big oak trees. A **Northern Harrier** coursed over the fields; a **Sharp-Shinned Hawk** zipping across the road scattered birds left and right; and **American Kestrels** and **Loggerhead Shrikes** hunted from the utility wires. We would have several flyovers of geese during the field trip, but the low-flying gaggle of **Snow Geese** on Robson also included at least one **Ross's Goose**, a new bird for the 2004 Caddo Parish list.

On Wallace Lake Dam Road, a roost of 47 **Black Vultures** sat in a field warming up their flight muscles in the cold morning air while five **Turkey Vultures** overlooked them from the trees. **Northern Cardinals** flew back and forth across the road and a flock of **American Goldfinches** were seen. We added **Song Sparrow** to the list here along with **House Wren**, **Carolina Wren** and **Yellow-bellied Sapsucker** and the first of three **Anhingas** we would see during the day flew over (the other two were seen from Bishop Point Road).

On the way to Lock and Dam No. 5, we stopped on LA 1 just south of Yearwood Road to check out the flooded area west of the railroad tracks. Almost 50 **Great Egrets** were feeding here as **Tree Swallows** swooped around them. Jerry Bertrand noticed that a couple of the swallows appeared to have dark collars. ME Lewis brought out her scope and the swallows obligingly perched so we could all view the tell-tale pale foreheads and dark throats of two very late **Cliff Swallows**. All previous late dates in the BSG database

for **Cliff Swallow** in northwestern Louisiana occur in the first week of October except for a single record on October 31, 1992, at the Natchitoches Fish Hatchery. Always a delight to see, a **Common Yellowthroat** flitted about an overgrown tangle of vines and trees on the other side of the highway.

On the road from Lock and Dam No. 5 to Bishop Point, we added **Red-tailed Hawk, Osprey, Belted Kingfisher, and Red-headed Woodpecker** to the day's list along with two more sparrow species, **Field Sparrow** and **Swamp Sparrow**. An immature **White Ibis**, an uncommon bird for this time of year, flew over the road and perched in a snag next to the beaver pond. Five **Pied-billed Grebes** paddled and dove in the pond behind him. Over 200 **American White Pelicans** were counted on the Red River at the Lock and Dam and Bishop Point as were a number of **Ring-billed Gulls**.

As we headed back to Shreveport, a **Cooper's Hawk** on Robinson Road (1.3 miles N of Yearwood Road) just off LA 1 was our sixth raptor species of the day. By the way, if you want to see a gazillion **Killdeer**, Robinson Road is the place for it as the agricultural fields on either side of the road are teeming with them. A pond on the east side of LA 1 north of Caspiana gave us our only ducks of the day, a group of 24 **Gadwall**, two **Mallard**, and one **Ring-necked Duck**. We ended the field trip thankful for a respite from the rain and high winds of most of the past week, life birds for some of our participants, new 2004 Caddo Parish birds for others, and the good times we always have when BSG'ers get together.

Birding with Radios

If you're thinking about purchasing or replacing your two-way FRS (Family Radio Service) radios, be sure to buy a radio with subcodes. The standard birding channel chosen by the American Birding Association (ABA) is channel 11, subcode 22. By using subcodes, you can reduce the level of interference from non-birding radio users in the area and, if you're in an spot frequented by birders, you may hear another birder report a sighting of just the bird you're looking for. The BSG has used two-way radios on field trips for inter-vehicular communication for several years now. In the coming months, we will be increasing our use of them to maintain contact while birding away from our vehicles. A two-way radio is a much more effective method of

getting other birders' attention than sign language, waving your arms around, or yelling when you're looking at a special bird. For an excellent article on the benefits of birding with radios and some tips on what features to look for when purchasing a radio, see the article "Using Radios for Birding" in the November/December 2004 issue of *Bird Watcher's Digest*.

MINUTES OF THE BOARD MEETING

November 2, 2004

Museum of Life Sciences at LSUS

Board members participating in the meeting were Mac Hardy, Jerry Bertrand, Jeff Trahan, Linda Adrion, Nancy Menasco, Lily Poole, Ron Martin, Nan Franks, Rosemary Seidler, Jean Trahan, Dennis Forshee, and Ann McLaurin.

Treasurer's Report – Jean Trahan distributed the regular monthly treasurer's report. For the month ending October 31, the club had \$2,262.20 in the bank. In addition, we had \$337.47 and \$341.00 in prepaid expenses at the post office and LSUS printing, respectively. The fund balance is \$2,940.67.

Old Business – At the last meeting, a proposal was made that the club join the Louisiana Wildlife Federation (LWF). A motion was made for the BSG to join the LWF if the cost will be \$15. The motion was approved. Mac Hardy said that Mark Wilson has agreed to enter data into the database.

New Business – Lily Poole asked if the BSG should participate in the *Bird Watcher's Digest* free publication exchange program for bird clubs. We would send them our newsletter each month and they would send us a free subscription to *Bird Watcher's Digest*. The board agreed that the club should participate in the exchange.

Beginning Birders – Dennis Forshee reported that five people attended the "Introduction to Birding" program and bird walk.

Field Trips – Nancy Menasco said that she needs a leader for the field trip to take place the November 28. Mac Hardy said that he would be able to do it if another person could not be coerced into leading the trip. Nancy reviewed the Christmas Bird Count dates.

Programs – Jerry Bertrand reviewed the upcoming programs. The club will watch the video *Watching Sparrows* at the November meeting, the Christmas party and auction will take place at the December meeting, and Mac Hardy will present a program on one of his travels at the January meeting.

Membership – Lily Poole reported 98 paid accounts.

BIRD REPORT – compiled November 30, 2004

Use the bird report to see what other birders have been seeing and where to go find the bird you want to see. Observers are abbreviated by the first and last initials. Dates and localities of observations are summarized under the observer's initials. Sightings are arranged by species. Following each species is a line of data in the following format: date, initials of the observer, number of birds observed, initials of another observer, number of birds they observed, etc. For the number of birds observed, a 1 is used for both 1 bird and for numbers not reported by the observer. For example: 01/12/99 BB 2 means that on January 12, 1999, BB saw two birds. Then by looking on the observer list, located after the sightings, you can determine that BB is Bob Birder and on 1/12/99 he was birding C. Bickham Dickson Park.

Report bird records for the newsletter to Mac Hardy by the 15th of each month. All bird records reported here are observations of the observers and are therefore the responsibility of the observer.
