LOS WINTER MEETING, LAFAYETTE, LA Friday, February 18 - Sunday, February 20, 2005

Louisiana Birders Anonymous (LABA), the Lafayette area bird club, is sponsoring the annual winter meeting. Information and registration forms for the meeting are available at the Louisiana Ornithological Society website at http://losbird.org/meetings.htm.

Membership in LOS is not required to participate in any of the LOS meetings, but you are encouraged to join to support the activities of our state society. Annual dues are \$20 for a regular membership and \$25 for a family membership. Three meetings are held each year with programs on Friday and Saturday nights, organized field trips on Saturday for the spring and fall meetings and on Saturday and Sunday for the winter meeting, and a banquet on Saturday night. The spring meeting is the last weekend in April; the fall meeting is the last weekend in October; and the winter meeting is usually held the last weekend in January in different locations around the state. Because of various conflicts, the winter meeting is being held in February this year.

GREAT BACKYARD BIRD COUNT

In keeping with the theme of this year's count, "North America's Great Backyard," Cornell Lab and Audubon are encouraging birders to visit national wildlife refuges, national forests, national parks, and other wild lands in addition to their own backyards. The BSG would like to encourage you to get out and bird northwestern Louisiana's own "Great Backyard." Choose one of the BSG Hot Spots, your own favorite birding location, or take the opportunity to visit somewhere entirely new, not forgetting your own backyard, of course. Complete instructions are available on the GBBC website, but the guidelines are simple: For each day of the count period, report the highest number of a particular species recorded at each location you bird. For example, on day one of the count, in your backyard you have one Northern Cardinal at 10:00 a.m., five at noon, and two at 2:00 p.m. You report five Northern Cardinals for your backyard (the highest number present at one time) for day one. You go birding the same day at Richard Fleming Park, where you spot six cardinals in one location. You report six Northern Cardinals for Richard Fleming Park. You start all over again for days two, three, and four.

As some BSG members will be attending the LOS winter meeting in Lafayette during part of the GBBC period, there will be no organized events for BSG participation in the GBBC this year. As a substitute for last year's mid-count strategy brunch, during the four-day count period, in addition to entering your sightings at the Great Backyard Bird Count website, you are encouraged to post your sightings and the areas you are covering to the BSG Bird Alert Service. This applies to backyard birders as well; several unique species were reported from BSG backyards last year. On Sunday night, I will tally the list of species turned in so far and post a list of missing species, so that those who have time can do some mop-up birding on Monday.

Last year, Bossier, Caddo, Claiborne, and DeSoto Parishes reported a total of 126 species; Shreveport ranked first in Louisiana and eighth in U.S. cities with 116 species reported, up from 90 species in 2002 and 102 species in 2003. Homer tied New Orleans for second place in Louisiana and two other northwestern Louisiana towns, Stonewall and Keithville, also repeated in the top ten Louisiana cities. With the LOS meeting conflict, it will be a challenge to top last year's count, but we know that BSG'ers love a challenge. The BSG database lists over 170 species that have been found in our area in the month of February, so let's see how many of them we can find! You can download a February (or any other monthly) checklist from the BSG website at http://www.birdstudygroup.org/SelectMoCheck.html.

Note: If you do not have access to the internet, call in your list to me or mail it to 503 Haynes Avenue, Shreveport, LA 71105, and I will enter your sightings at the GBBC website. Be sure to include the city or zip code for all sightings.

Tenkiller Lake encompasses almost 13,000 acres in north-central Oklahoma not far from the Arkansas border. With depths up to 165 feet or more, it is a loon magnet. In addition to over 200 **Common Loons**, so far this year **Red-throated Loon**, **Pacific Loon**, and **Yellow-billed Loon** have also been sighted on Tenkiller.

Meet at the LSUS Museum of Life Sciences at 1:45 p.m. on Friday for departure at 2:00 p.m. to caravan to the Ouachita Mountains Biological Station (OMBS) near Mena, Arkansas, to spend the night. The station has sleeping accommodations, showers, and kitchen

facilities. On Saturday, we will journey to Tenkiller Lake, where we will spend the day birding, then return to the OMBS Saturday night. We will return to Shreveport on Sunday. There will be an opportunity on the way home on Sunday to search for the **Black Phoebe**, which is being seen at Beavers Bend State Park.

There is no charge for lodging at the OMBS. Dinner Friday night and breakfast Saturday and Sunday mornings will be served at the station. Bring a lunch for Saturday. Dinner Saturday night will be at a restaurant near Tenkiller Lake.

What to bring: Two-way radios, scope, sleeping bag or something similar, linens, blankets (beds and cots are equipped with mattresses but no linens), pillow, towel, \$10 for dinner and two breakfasts at the OMBS, lunch for Saturday, snacks, beverages. You may want to bring a sit-upon or folding chair for loon watching.

Owl Prowl

My first experience as BSG trip leader was on January 16, 2005, leading the Owl Prowl. I have been on several Owl Prowls and am frequently out in the field at night. I think that most of the fun of owling is actually getting outside at night in the middle of nowhere with your flashlight and listening as all of the sounds of the night surround you.

Thirteen participants joined me in venturing out in the winter night to listen for owls. Trip participants were Mac Hardy, Rosemary Seidler, Chris and Sarah Bertrand, Kevin Hunter, Neilson Jacobs, Ann Jarrell, Sarah Hancock, Rachel Demascal, Bill Selvers, John McBride, Nancy Menasco, and Jerry Bertrand. Birds seen or heard on the Owl Prowl were Barn Owl, Great Horned Owl, Eastern Screech-Owl, and Barred Owl.

The group met at the Museum of Life Sciences and caravanned out to Yearwood Road. Several members of the group saw two **Great Horned Owls** along LA 1 between LA 175 and Caspiana. One car even had a close encounter as the owl came uncomfortably close to the car. The owl ended up perched on a telephone pole flanking the road.

Our first scheduled stop was at an old barn on Yearwood road. The day prior to the trip I visited the barn and flushed out a **Barn Owl**. I inspected the barn and saw fresh owl pellets littering the ground. I felt confident that this owl would be a sure thing if we could only get there with enough daylight to see it. On the evening of the trip as the daylight was fading, a bird flew from the barn. The consensus of the group was that that bird looked more like a hawk than a **Barn Owl** and with the terrible light conditions the hawk went unidentified. Well, just goes to show you in birding there is no such thing as a sure thing.

Our next stop was at the silos on the Bayou Pierre Wildlife Management Area. Mac Hardy checked the silos and **Barn Owl** nest platforms for owls, but none were present. At this stop we called for owls, but all we heard were frogs (Upland Chorus Frogs and Southern Leopard Frogs).

We moved down the road to a grassy area to try to call in **Short-eared Owls**. John McBride loaned me a

CD with the short-eared owl's call on it. We called and called but were only answered by **Eastern Screech-Owls**, a **Great Horned Owl**, and a **Barred Owl**. As we were spot lighting for the screech owls we spotted a **Barn Owl** fly from a nearby tree. The owl was only seen by a few of us and for only a short time but all who saw it felt confident that because of its pale color, size, and shape that it was definitely a **Barn Owl**. It was not the beautiful dramatic look at a **Barn Owl** that I had hoped for the group, but it counts. A distress call I was playing to bring in owls also called in a pack of coyotes. We could hear the vocalizations among the pack as they traveled nearby.

One thing I have not mentioned until now is the cold temperature during the owl prowl; it was in the high 30's. It was not technically freezing but if you ask most of the participants, they would probably tell you that they were freezing. One way to offset the cold temperature is to have snacks and warm drinks in your car.

We turned around and headed back to where the Prairie River crosses Yearwood Road. At this stop we located two red-phase screech-owls (one on each side of the road). Both owls were perched on small trees, about 3 feet above the water. Jerry Bertrand helped me spotlight both owls and everyone enjoyed looking at the owls that we had been hearing all evening. Other owls heard at this stop were a **Barred Owl** and a **Great Horned Owl**.

We made one more stop just a little further north on Yearwood road to call for **Short-eared Owls**, but again no response. At this spot I called it a night. In total it was a successful owl prowl with four out of five owl species. I considered it a personal success because of the actual visual sighting of the wild, live screech-owl. The screech-owl has eluded me on numerous occasions always vocalizing and not showing themselves. I have also encountered many in the captive or dead form but never a wild, live screech-owl. It was an exciting event to see that red-phase screech-owl calling back to our tape.

BSG Birding Competition for 2005

To promote birding throughout the BSG area in 2005, the BSG is sponsoring birding competitions for beginning through advanced birders in an eight-parish area of northwestern Louisiana. The parishes included are Bienville, Bossier, Caddo, Claiborne, DeSoto, Natchitoches, Red River, and Webster. This is a continuing effort to encourage the study of the avifauna of this area and the reporting of sightings to the BSG database. The computerized database is maintained by Mac Hardy at the LSUS Museum of Life Sciences and presently includes over 160,000 records extending over a 50-year period.

There are three different competitions this year:

Parish List Competition – This is a repeat of last year's competition. There will be eight individual parish competitions with the winner in each parish being the birder with the highest number of species in that parish and an overall competition with the winner being the birder with the highest total number of species for all parishes. Here's how this works: Let's say you have ten species in each of the eight parishes; then your total overall species count for the competition is 80 species. You could have the same ten species in all eight parishes or ten different species in each parish; your overall total is still 80 species.

<u>Life list competition</u> - Geared toward new birders, the winner of this competition will be the birder who reports the most additions to his or her world life list in the eight-parish northwestern Louisiana area. Note that these must be additions to your world life list not just your northwestern Louisiana life list. example, you saw a Bewick's Wren in the San Antonio, Texas, area last year. This year in Caddo Parish, you spot the first Bewick's Wren you have ever seen in northwestern Louisiana. Even though this is a first for you for northwestern Louisiana, it is not an addition to your life list, so it does not count in the BSG life list competition. Here's another example: You travel to Cameron Parish for the LOS spring meeting where you add Reddish Egret to your life list. Although this is an addition to your world life list, you did not see it in one of the eight northwestern Louisiana parishes listed above; therefore, it does not count for the BSG competition. Here's a final example: While birding at Walter B. Jacobs Memorial Nature Park, you spot a Red-breasted Nuthatch. This is a life bird for you. Congratulations, this bird <u>does</u> count for the BSG life list competition.

<u>"Golden Bird" Competition</u> – This contest is modeled on The Big Sit! The Golden Bird Competition is for gung-ho and casual birders alike. At the end of the year, competitors will turn in a list of species seen or heard in the eight-parish area in 2005. One species, the "Golden Bird," will be selected from this list in a random drawing. The names of all the birders who turned in this particular species will be included in a second drawing to determine the overall winner.

While everyone is encouraged to report sightings to the BSG database, the life list and Golden Bird competitors are not required to do so. The minimum information required for reporting a sighting to the BSG database is the species of bird, the date, parish, location, and observers. Note that if you are on a BSG field trip, the trip leader is responsible for turning in a trip list; participants should not turn in duplicates of this list. A Snapshot of 2004 Great Backyard Bird Count Findings

Last winter, as part of the Great Backyard Bird Count, bird enthusiasts across North America submitted almost 50,000 checklists totaling more than four million birds of 512 species during the February count. The event, one of the largest citizen-science projects in the

world, documented regional declines of the American Crow that may be the result of West Nile virus in those regions. These crows were reported in alarmingly fewer numbers in Illinois and Ohio, where West Nile virus has had a strong presence, backing findings from the Christmas Bird Count and a winter-long citizen-science project, Project FeederWatch. "This decrease may or may not be related to West Nile, but the situation is certainly something we need to pay attention to," says John Fitzpatrick, director at the Cornell Lab of Ornithology. Crows are very vulnerable to the virus.

Other species showed increases last year during the GBBC. Participants in the eastern United States counted more **Dark-eyed Juncos** than they had since GBBC 2000, perhaps because of the massive snowstorm that hit the eastern seaboard during the weekend of the count, driving birds to feeders in high numbers. That same snowstorm apparently held early migrants like **Redwinged Blackbird**, **Eastern Meadowlark**, and **American Woodcock** farther south, compared to previous years.

In the West, Mountain Bluebirds were reported farther south than the year before, and all of the Rosy-Finches (Black, Gray-crowned, and Brown-capped) were documented farther north. In previous years, GBBC maps of Eurasian Collared-Doves, introduced in the Bahamas before reaching Florida in the 1980s, showed the species spreading quickly northwestward. Last year's maps show no change, suggesting a slowdown in the rate at which the bird's range is spreading.

How will this winter compare with the last six? What will it reflect about our bird populations? The participation of novice and expert bird watchers alike will help us answer these questions. "We need every birder to participate with us," said Audubon's director of citizen science Paul Green. "The Great Backyard Bird Count has become an important means of gathering data to help birds, but it can't happen unless people take part. Whether you're a novice or an expert, we need you to help us help birds."

MINUTES OF THE BOARD MEETING January 4, 2005 Museum of Life Sciences at LSUS

Board members participating in the meeting were Jerry Bertrand, Jeff Trahan, Linda Adrion, Nancy Menasco, Lily Poole, Rosemary Seidler, Jean Trahan, Hubert Hervey, Dennis Forshee, Amanda Crnkovic, and Mac Hardy.

Treasurer's Report – Jean Trahan distributed the regular monthly treasurer's report. For the month

ending December 31, the club had \$2,879.98 in the bank. In addition, we had \$273.15 and \$286.86 in prepaid expenses at the post office and LSUS printing, respectively. The fund balance is \$3,439.99. Jean also reported that the Christmas auction took in \$559.50.

Privacy Policy – A proposed privacy policy was discussed. The policy was written by Barney Poole and would be placed on the club's webpage. Several suggestions were made to alter the proposed policy. The policy will be changed and reviewed at the next board meeting.

Publicity – Michele Andrews was not present, but sent a letter to be reviewed by the board. In particular, Michele wrote a letter to be sent to Mr. Alan English, editor of *The Times*, which is the local newspaper. The letter thanks and praises Mr. Jimmie Watson for his help in publishing information about the club's meetings. The letter was approved by the board and will be sent to Mr. English.

New Business – A suggestion was made that the board not meet every month. This was discussed and it was decided that we skip the February and April meetings this month. There was no objection to doing this. Also, the board will meet every other month next year except if there is a particular need for another meeting.

Bird Competition –During the previous calendar year, the club had a competition to see who could see the most species of bird in each parish in the BSG area and also who could see the most species in all of the BSG parishes combined. The board decided that February 15 will be the deadline for submitting lists of numbers of species seen to Amanda Crnkovic. Rosemary Seidler will send out a notice to this effect on the BSG birdalert.

Suggestions for the 2005 bird competition were made. The board agreed that the new competition will have three parts. a) Recognition will be given to the BSG member who sees the most new life birds in the BSG area. The birds must be seen in the BSG area, and they must be birds the person has never seen before. b) The Golden Bird Award. Members will submit a list of all birds seen in the BSG area. Of all the species submitted, one species will be randomly chosen to be the Golden Bird. Recognition will be given to that person who has seen that bird in the BSG area. If more than one person has seen the Golden Bird species, one of those people who has seen it will be randomly selected to receive the Golden Bird recognition. c) The Standard Competition. Recognition will be given to each person who sees the most species in each of the parishes of the BSG area. Recognition will also be given to the club member who sees the most species in all of the parishes in the BSG area combined. To be more specific, a club

member will add up all of the species seen in each parish. The club member with the greatest sum will receive the recognition. The competitions will be publicized in the club's newsletter.

Great Backyard Bird Count – The Great Backyard Bird Count occurs at the same time as the LOS winter meeting. Not everyone will be able to participate because of this conflict. It appears that there will not be as much coordination this year.

Field Trips – Nancy Menasco reported on upcoming field trips. These can be found in the newsletter. Also, Nancy would like to have field trips in each of the parishes of the BSG area this year. She asked for suggestions for places to bird in these parishes.

Membership – Lily Poole said that the club has 102 paid accounts.

MINUTES OF THE REGULAR MEETING January 11, 2005, 7:00 p.m. Museum of Life Sciences at LSUS

Program – Mac Hardy presented a program on his recent trip to Sri Lanka.

Field Trips – Nancy Menasco provided information about upcoming field trips. An owl prowl will be led by Amanda Crnkovic on January 16. Jim Ingold will lead a trip to Cheneyville to see Sandhill Cranes and waterfowl on January 29. Nancy then described the new contest that has three parts that will be held by the club during the year 2005. These contests are the following: a) Most Species Competition. Recognition will be given to each person who sees the most species of birds in each of the eight parishes in the BSG area and also for the one person who sees the most species of birds in all of the eight parishes combined; b) Life List Competition.

Recognition will be given to the person who adds the most bird species to their life list. These birds must be new life birds and must be seen in the eight parish area; c) Golden Bird Competition. Participants should turn in a list of all birds seen in the eight-parish area during the year. A single species will be randomly chosen to be the "golden bird." All participants who have seen that species will be pooled together and one of those participants will be randomly chosen to be recognized as winner of the golden bird contest.

Bird Talk – Hubert Hervey said that he bought a tape from R. P. Sporting Goods in Mansfield of a young woodpecker in distress. He played this tape during the BCBCBC and discovered it was effective in attracting birds. Nancy Menasco said she searched for a **Bewick's Wren** all of last year, but did not see one. However, last week she saw two of them on Hart's Island Road.

BIRD REPORT – compiled January 25, 2005

Use the bird report to see what other birders have been seeing and where to go find the bird you want to see. Observers are abbreviated by the first and last initials. Dates and localities of observations are summarized under the observer's initials. Sightings are arranged by species. Following each species is a line of data in the following format: date, initials of the observer, number of birds observed, initials of another observer, number of birds they observed, etc. For the number of birds observed, a 1 is used for both 1 bird and for numbers not reported by the observer. For example: 01/12/99 BB 2 means that on January 12, 1999, BB saw two birds. Then by looking on the observer list, located after the sightings, you can determine that BB is Bob Birder and on 1/12/99 he was birding C. Bickham Dickson Park.

Report bird records for the newsletter to Mac Hardy by the 15th of each month. All bird records reported here are observations of the observers and are therefore the responsibility of the observer.
