

Minutes of the Last Meeting

The regular monthly meeting of the SSNS Bird Study Group was held Tuesday, 11 June 1991, in Room 229 of the Science Building on the LSUS campus. President Will Smolenski called the meeting to order at 7:04 P.M. Visitors and guests were welcomed. Linda Smith and Betsy Risinger were our visitors.

Minutes of the last meeting were accepted as recorded in the last newsletter.

Betty Mason gave her financial report starting with a balance of \$1,627.27. Income fro the month was \$120.00, expenses \$38.70, leaving a balance of \$1,708.57. The mailing balance at the post office was \$195.33.

Will gave the names of the new officers elected at the June board meeting. Will was elected to remain as president with a rousing applause. Hubert Hervey will serve as vice president, Norma Cobb as secretary, with

Caroline Upchurch putting the minutes on a disk for Mac Hardy to put in the newsletter. Betty Mason will serve again as treasurer.

Will reported tha Larry Raymond and he attended the Red River Wetlands Coalition meeting. Plans are to purchase 12,000 acres of wetlands around Bayou Bodcau. Unused money from the Red River Waterways amounts to probably enough money to purchase this tract of land. He encouraged us to write letters to Congressman Jim McCrery and Senator J. Bennett Johnston asking them to use this money for purchase of the wetlands. Will had given T-shirts at the board meeting to some that promised to write letters. Caroline Upchurch wore and modeled her shirt for us and brought copies of her letters.

Will reported that beginner birding was discussed at the board meeting and more at the board meeting and more outings of this type will be planned for the new year. Books are ideal as a place to start birding.

The group took turns giving reports of birds seen recently. The Inca Dove of Oil City, Orioles along Red River, a Lark Sparrow, a Rose-breasted Grosbeak, House Finches, and a family of Brown Thrashers were mentioned. Velda Neilson gave an exciting report of a Painted Bunting and hearing cooing sound that led her to a Greater Roadrunner.

Bill Wood reported on the yearly competition of bird species sightings between Charlie Lyon and himself. Bill had 246 sightings and Charlie 241. Charlie was not present to verify this.

We were reminded of the outing for June 22 to Wallace Lake led by Hubert Hervey.

Will refreshed our memories of the Bird Study Group not meeting in July and August but resuming in September.

We were invited to the Museum after the program for refreshments and fellowship.

Bill Wood presented our program on "Status Update of the Attwater Prarie Chicken." The Attwater Wildlife Refuge consists of 8,000 acres in Texas. This Prarie Chicken has decreased from millions to 66 at Bill's last check. He observed from a

blind and took beautiful pictures. He also told us where old Port-o-lets go when they pass on; they make blinds out of them.

We were asked after the program to turn in names for the mailing list, also to put our names on the committee list we would like to serve on. John McBride will purchase books. More people are needed to help at the Museum to answer the phone, work in the gift shop, etc.

The meeting closed and we move to the Museum. An International Paper Company bird house was given away. Refreshments and fellowship was enjoyed by all.

MINUTES OF THE BOARD MEETING

The Board met on Tuesday, 4 June 1991, at the home of Will Smolenski. Board members present were Norma Cobb, Mac Hardy, Hubert Hervey, Shirley Huss, Jim Ingold, Charlie Lyon, Betty Mason, Jim McCain, Jr., Velda Neilson, Larry Raymond, Dick Rolandt, Rosemary Seidler, Will Smolenski, and Caroline Upchurch. John McBride also attended the meeting. President Will Smolenski called the meeting to order at 7:10 P.M.

Will asked for any additions or corrections to the board minutes as recorded in the May newsletter. There were none and a motion was made and passed to approve the minutes as recorded.

Betty Mason gave the treasurer's report. She reported a May balance of \$1,627.27, income of \$50.00, and expenses of \$38.70, leaving a balance of \$1,638.57. The post office balance is the same as reported at the May regular meeting.

The election of officers for the 1991-92 year was held. Will Smolenski was nominated to serve another year as President, Hubert Hervey was nominated as Vice-President, Norma Cobb was nominated as Secretary, and Betty Mason was nominated to serve another year as Treasurer. All of the nominees were unanimously elected. Caroline Upchurch agreed to help Norma as secretary, especially with transcribing the minutes onto a word

processor.

Will reported that he and Larry attended a meeting of the Red River Wetlands Coalition called by Skipper Dickson. As a result of this meeting, Will has written Congressman Jim McCrery and Senator J. Bennett Johnston encouraging them to lobby for funds for the acquisition of 12,000 acres of wetlands near Bayou Bodcau. Will asked board members to write letters as individuals making the same request. Red River Wetlands Coalition t-shirts were given out as incentives to write. Will also reported that he will attend a 1:30 P.M. meeting at The Times on 5 June concerning this issue.

Mac Hardy asked about committee chairmen for the 1991-92 year. Will noted that as President he will appoint the various chairmen. Betty recommended that an historian or archives committee be appointed to keep the Bird Study Group scrapbook up-to-date once she completes it.

Charlie Lyon reported that Bill Wood will present the June program on "Status Update of the Attwater's Prarie Chicken."

Velda Neilson requested that the board try to provide more activities for beginner birders. She has had several people comment to her regarding the need for more beginner-oriented activities. The board discussed at length possible activities including programs on the use of binoculars, field guides, birding vocabulary and related topics. A suggestion to offer birding workshops was discussed and it was decided to try to have a birding workshop for beginners sometime in late fall. Charlie Lyon, John McBride, Jim Ingold, Mac Hardy, and Larry Raymond were suggested as possible copresenters of such a hands-on workshop.

Velda noted that members want more time to visit and discuss birds seen at the meetings. Mac suggested that we should have a refreshment time again, perhaps in the Museum. After some discussion, it was decided to provide a short period of time at the meetings for members to report birds seen, and to have refreshments in the Museum after the next meeting.

The next scheduled field trip is Saturday, June 22, to Wallace Lake. Hubert

Hervey will serve as the leader of this outing. The June 1 field trip to see the Red-cockaded Woodpeckers did not materialize since no one showed up to lead the trip. In the future, the group leader's phone number will be included in the newsletter so that members interested in participating in an outing can check with the leader.

Shirley Huss reported that membership is staying around 135 paid members. A number of membership reminders have been sent out to those members who need to renew their memberships. John McBride suggested that we mail our newsletter to other bird groups around the country, and request their newsletter in return.

Will asked the hospitality committee to try to have cokes and cookies at the next regular meeting. Betty agreed to purchase the cookies and Will volunteered to bring the drinks.

Larry reported that he was unable to find a good Caddo/Bossier map at Globe Map Company for the Birding Hotspots booklet. He will keep looking for a better map.

Dick Rolandt reported that the phone tree has not been used recently because no unusual birds have been reported.

John McBride discussed the card file for bird sightings and its importance. He listed some of the specific information that should be reported, including dates of first arrival and last observation, sightings of nestlings, and other important life history information. He also emphasized the importance of photographing rare birds, nestlings, unusual behavior, etc.

Will stated that Bobbe Wommack reported to him that Pet Pro and Kamper's Korner want to be kept on our mailing list, and that both want extra copies of the newsletter for their stores. Pet Pro would like to advertise in the newsletter. The board agreed to consider advertisements at the next meeting after determining rates, guidelines for advertisements, and other details.

Mac asked how many extra copies of the newsletter would be needed. It was decided to print ten (10) extra copies each for Pet Pro and Kamper's Korner. Will stated that the board needs to make a decision regarding the purchase of a book in the name of Vera Lee Grubbs. A motion was made and passed to purchase a book in the memory of Vera Lee.

John McBride volunteered to buy books for the Bird Study Group library. Mac pointed out that we already have a list of books to buy that have not been purchased. John also suggested that we consider buying life memberships in a variety of bird organizations to receive their journals.

Will announced that Bill Hall will remain in charge of outings.

No other business was brought up and the meeting adjourned at 9:30 P.M.

Report bird records for the Newsletter to Connie Conners (865-6422) by the 25th of each month. Only records not printed since the last Newsletter are published.

Following each species is a line of data in the following format: date, initials of observer, number of birds observed; initials of another observer, number of birds observed; etc.). For example: 15 PD 3; BM 1,5) means that on the fifteenth PD saw 3 birds, BW saw 1 at one locality and 5 at another. For the number of birds observed, a one is used both for one specimen or for numbers not reported by the observer. Two (or more) numbers following an observer are numbers of birds seen at two (or more) different localities. The month is abbreviated only if it is the month preceding the one being reported.
