## FIELD TRIPS

**FEBRUARY 15** -- Bird banding (principally American Goldfinches) at Paul Dickson's. We will also get to view Paul's collection of exotic waterfowl. Contact Paul (798-1000) for the starting time.

**MARCH 7** -- Bodcau Wildlife Management Area to see Wild Turkeys. Also will see woodland and meadow birds; perhaps some early spring migrants. Leave at 5:00 A.M. in car pool from LSUS parking lot next to the Museum. We need to be in place for the turkeys by daybreak. Contact Paul (798-1000) for more information.

**MARCH 21** -- LSU Experiment Station and Pat Sewell's farm for the last of the winter residents and the first of the spring migrants. Perhaps Sprague's Pipits, Horned Larks, Western Meadowlarks, and various shorebirds. Leave by carpool at 7:00 A.M. from the LSUS Museum parking lot. Contact Bill Hall (797-1727).

**APRIL 11** -- Bickham-Dickson Park for spring migrants, warblers, and shorebirds. Meet at 8:00 A.M. at the Bickham-Dickson horsebarn. Contact Bill Hall (797-1727).

**APRIL 18** -- Hubert Hervey's Berry and Dairy Farm for spring migrants, woodland, pasture, and meadow birds. Carpool from the LSUS Museum parking lot at 8:00 A.M. Contact Hubert Hervey (925-9249).

**MAY 1-3** -- A week-end trip you will remember. The Louisiana Ornithological Society Spring Meeting in Cameron, Louisiana. Spring migrants to blow your mind! Anyone interested in nature and/or birds must do

Report bird records for the Newsletter to Connie Conners (865-6422) by the 25<sup>th</sup> of each month. Only records not printed since the last Newsletter are published.

Following each species is a line of data in the following format: date, initials of observer, number of birds observed; initials of another observer, number of birds observed; etc.). For example: 15 PD 3; BW 1,5) means that on the fifteenth PD saw 3 birds, BW saw 1 at one locality and 5 at another. For the number of birds observed, a one is used both for one specimen or for numbers not reported by the observer. Two (or more) numbers following an observer are numbers of birds seen at two (or more) different localities.
