Paul Dickson explained to us the concern of the Red River Wetlands Coalition about the Dangerfield Reach Project. This project is to make the Red River navigable on to Jefferson, Texas. This would cause a loss of property and wetlands.

Bill Wood has been made Editor of the LOS newsletter and encouraged us to join the LOS. The cost is \$10.00 a year and you receive six newsletters.

Remember the Big Day at Paul Dickson's on May 9. Several door prizes were given next. The new checklists are ready with added birds.

A request was made from North Toledo Bend State Park for leaders to guide birders on the weekends.

Report bird records for the Newsletter to Connie Connors (865-6422) by the 25th of each month. Only records not printed since last Newsletter are published.

Following each species is a line of data in the following format: date, initials of observer, number of birds observed; initials of another observer, number of birds observed; etc.). For example: 15 PD 3; BW 1,5) means that on the fifteenth PD saw 3 birds, BW saw 1 at one locality and 5 at another. For the number of birds observed, a one is used both for one specimen or for numbers not reported by the observer. Two (or more) numbers following an observer are numbers of birds seen at two (or more) different localities. All bird records reported here are the responsibility of the observer. The Bird Study Group is reporting observations on the word of the observers.
