PRESIDENT'S MESSAGE

I'm looking forward to this year and hope you plan to meet with the Bird Study Group to learn more about our favorite creatures -- the feathered ones -- except for the few of you who prefer the scaled creatures. Rosemary Seidler is working to see that we have the best speakers and programs ever. Bill Hall has the experience to see that our field trips are better and more timely than ever. Both the phone tree and bird hot line will be in use again this year. We also want to do more to assist beginning birders, as they gain from the years of experience many of you are so willing to share. Your suggestions are encouraged. Fall migration is just beginning and our wintering bird population will soon be here, so come and enjoy the birding year with us.

At our first club meeting on September 8, we will sign up a day of counting hawks on Saturday, September 26. Other outings will be announced at this meeting.

Big News -- North Toledo Bend State Park (NTBSP) will be conducting a bird walk on the last Saturday of each month, except during the winter months of December, January, and February. These walks will be led by park naturalist Pete Wilson and leave at 8 a.m. from the park headquarters area. NTBSP is a lovely wooded area on Toledo Bend lake, west of Zwolle. It is about 2 hours from Shreveport. Watch for signs.

My best birding this summer includes a family group of **Swainson's Hawks** near Lake Charles, **Worm-eating Warblers** northwest of Plain Dealing and **Red-cockaded Woodpeckers** northwest of Bodcau Bayou WMA. The egret rookery with thousands of breeding birds of 8 species at Barksdale AFB was also exciting and outstanding.

Report bird records for the Newsletter to **Connie Connors (865-6422)** by the 25th of each month. Only records not printed since last Newsletter are published.

Following each species is a line of data in the following format: date, initials of observer, number of birds observed; initials of another observer, number of birds observed; etc.). For example: 15 PD 3; BW 1,5 means that on the fifteenth PD saw 3 birds, BW saw 1 at one locality and 5 at another. For the number of birds observed, a one is used both for one specimen or for numbers not reported by the observer. Two (or more) numbers following an observer are numbers of birds seen at two (or more) different localities. All bird records reported here are the responsibility of the observer. The Bird Study Group is reporting observations on the word of the observers.

ANSWERS TO BIRD QUIZ #4 - KENTUCKY FRIED BIRD QUIZ

1. Uncinate process - A backward projecting piece of the rib that helps to stabilize the ribcage.
2. Pygostyle - The projection from the back of the bird that contains the uropygial gland, the tail feathers and caudal vertebrae.
3. Patagium - A fold of skin on the the leading edge of the wing.
4. Uropygial gland - The only skin gland in birds, the oil is used to maintain the feathers.
5. Pterylae - The feather tracts or the places from which the body or contour feathers leave the skin.
