President's Message

NAMC Results for Caddo Parish

Thirteen of our members spent Saturday, May 14th, looking for migrants in Caddo Parish. We split into seven parties and covered the parish well. Caddo is a large parish of 933 square miles. On the Texas side it is 54 miles long and touches four Texas counties (Cass, Marion, Harrison, and Panola). Next to Miller County, Arkansas, Caddo Parish is only 12.6 miles wide. It widens to 33 miles on the south which borders DeSoto and Red River Parishes. And the eastern border formed by the Red River and adjoining Bossier Parish is many, many miles long [about 93 miles--ed.]. (Continued on p. 3)

Black-tailed Godwit -- May 13; breeding female sighted in rice fields south of Rayne, Louisiana, by Charlie Lyon. **First State Record.**

King Eider -- May 24; immature male at Grand Terre Island east of Grand Isle, LA. **First State Record**, second sighting ever on Gulf coast; by Charlie Lyon.

Thayer's Gull -- May 30; first year bird seen by Roger Breedlove, Charlie Lyon, and Robby Bacon on Rutherford Beach in Cameron Parish.

Hudsonian Godwit -- May 8; on LSUS campus by Jim Ingold.

White-rumped Sandpiper -- May 8; on LSUS campus by Horace Jeter and Jim Ingold.

Bobolink -- May 14; ten individuals in fields

and fence rows at St. Johns Church Road, Hosston, Louisiana, by Jeff, Jean, and Catherine Trahan.

House Finch -- May 8; photographed on the nest at the Joe D. Waggoner Federal Building, Shreveport, by Rosemary Seidler.

Connecticut Warbler -- May 14; Cross Lake at West Lakeshore Drive by Larry Raymond.

President's Message

(Continued from page 1) If you like guessing games go ahead and guess the most common species we counted before reading further. The bird life here varies according to the land use. Red River bottomland has different birds from the hill land nearby. The most common bird on this years count was 459 **Dickcissels**. This noisy bird was apparently missing in two hill areas even though it nests in abundant numbers in our valley grasslands nearby. They were so noisy as to nearly drown out a group of **Bobolinks** near Hosston. The second highest counted species was **Northern Mockingbird** with 345. Third was **Northern Cardinal** with 275. I was surprised and pleased with our top three birds. **Dickcissel**, **Northern Mockingbird**, and **Northern Cardinal** are birds that we all like to see and it is a pleasure to know that they are doing well here. The following list includes birds that have undoubtedly benefitted from their acceptance of habitat changes we have made. **Barn Swallow**, 201; **Mourning Dove**, 196; **Purple Martin**, 193; **Common Grackle**, 192; and **Red-winged Blackbird**, 184.

With a majority of Caddo Parish in woodlands I was surprised to find low numbers in some woodland birds. Perhaps they are harder to locate. **Red-eyed Vireo**, 37; **Pine Warbler**, 37; **Eastern Wood-Pewee**, 33; **Brown-headed Nuthatch**, 26; **Red-headed Woodpecker**, 14; and **Acadian Flycatcher**, 7.

Caddo Lake, Soda Lake, Cross Lake, and Wallace Lake are all included in part or whole in Caddo Parish. Our water birds were doing well, although, by 14 May nearly all ducks except **Wood Ducks** have migrated north. **Great Blue Heron**, 90; **Great Egret**, 50; **Green Heron**, 23;

and **Snowy Egret**, 5.

Top birds had to be **Connecticut Warbler**, 1, **Bobolink**, 10+, **Eastern Phoebe** nesting on her second brood, 2, and **Olive-sided Flycatcher**, 1.

We found 108 species compared with 111 on 8 May 1993.

INCA DOVES

IN NW LOUISIANA:

A SHORT HISTORY by Jim Ingold

The **Inca Dove** (*Columbina inca*) was first seen in NW Louisiana by Mr. Lamar Fruge of Oil City on 24 March 1991. The birds were feeding on bird seed in his driveway. Many observations were made that spring on the birds in Oil City. On 4 April 1991 Mac Hardy, Will Smolenski, and myself saw 5 doves at one time and observed courtship behavior. Mr. Fruge had seen many mating attempts. No observations of these birds were made in 1992 (Lack of effort?). The Oil City birds have been seen in both 1993 and 1994. No other reports of **Inca Doves** were made in 1992 or 1993.

In the spring of this year, **Inca Doves** have been widely reported. The first record was of a bird that flew into a patio door and was killed. The specimen was brought to the Museum of Life Sciences by Dr. John Hall of the Department of Computer Sciences and Geography at LSUS. He found the dead bird on 2 March 1994 in southeast Shreveport just south of LSUS. The bird was

prepared as a museum specimen and was identified as a female. Clyde Massey was the next to report **Inca Doves** (03/14/94) in his neighborhood in Bossier City just south of the Barksdale Air Force Base. I then discovered them in my Bossier City neighborhood just off McDade Street (03/19/94). A student of mine, Richard Johnson saw two birds in his northeast Bossier City neighborhood. I banded these two birds on 30 April 1994. One bird was dripping a fluid from the beak which I assume to be pigeons milk, a substance they feed to newly hatched young. This bird was fairly dark on the top side and much paler on the bottom. It looked very much like the bird pictured in the bottom picture in The Audubon Society Master Guide to Birding. The second bird had what seemed to be an incubation or brood patch. This bird was very pale all over much like the bird in the top picture in The Audubon Society Master Guide to Birding. I banded a third bird in this same yard on 18 May 1994. This bird was dark on top and much lighter below. On this same day, Hubert Hervey and Pat Tuminello saw an **Inca Dove** two miles north of Evelyn on LA 510 near Coushatta.

We do not have at this time any proof that the birds are nesting in NW Louisiana although it is most likely. We also are missing records from winter. Do they now winter here? Will they winter here in the future?

MINUTES: LAST MEETING

The LOS spring meeting had a record number of participants who saw 216 species of birds. A side trip to Grand Island included observations of **King Eider** and **Purple Sandpiper**. The **King Eider** is new for Louisiana.

Hudsonian Godwits were seen by Jim Ingold Sunday 8 May on LSUS campus.

Migration count is scheduled for Saturday 14 May 1994. Participants will meet at Larry Raymond's house for tallying the observations.

The new date for the field trip to Walter Jacobs Nature Park is Saturday 21 June at 7:30 am. The Barksdale trip will be 4 June. Meeting place will be the Short Stop in Shreve City at 7:30 am.

Hubert showed enlargements of the breeding bird atlas color satellite photographs he had made at Insty Prints.

Mac Hardy discussed the Red River Balloon Rally to be held 21-24 July 1994. Ideas for participating will be taken at the next regular meeting.

An interest page for the canoe float down Bodcau Bayou was circulated. Hubert also passed around information from Norris Outfitters.

Betty Mason read a letter from the Nature Conservancy thanking us for support in the past and asking to raise our contribution. It was voted to raise the our contribution from \$100 to \$150 per year. She also mentioned receiving the Bastrop Audubon Newsletter.

Mac circulated raffle tickets to aid the effort to build a zoo. Price is \$1.00 and the prize is a balloon ride for two plus extras.

Vickey Lefever mentioned she had a book on birding Colorado and she would let people borrow it. She also has a list of Colorado birders who would enjoy taking others out birding.

It was affirmed to send a card to Ruth Smolenski who just had surgery.

Rosemary Seidler has located a **House Finch** nest in the parking garage across from the Waggoner Federal Building downtown Shreveport.

The main program was given by Bruce Flaig. The program was a bird and nature slide show. After a refreshment break Hubert showed a short video on the birds and birding areas in Texas produced by Texas Parks and Wildlife.

The meeting adjourned at 8:45 p.m.

ANSWERS TO BIRD QUIZ #22

2. The **Inca Dove** usually lays 2 eggs per clutch.
3. In the northern areas it lays only one clutch per year but in the southern end of its breeding range it may lay more than one since it has been recorded breeding during most months.
4. Its eggs are white.
5. It is famous for roosting on the backs of other **Inca Doves**. There may actually be three tiers of birds.

Taxonomic changes for the birds of northwestern Louisiana.

The "Thirty-ninth supplement to the American Ornithologists' Union *Check-list of North American Birds*" (Auk 110(3):675-682, 1993) was just published (and now official) within the last few weeks. This supplement documents 38 changes; however, only the following three affect species known to occur in northwestern Louisiana. The new common name and species is given first, followed by the old names in parentheses. **Green Heron**, *Butorides virescens* (Green-backed Heron, *B. striatus*); **White-tailed Kite**, *Elanus leucurus* (Black-shouldered Kite, *E. caeruleus*); **American Golden-Plover**, *Pluvialis dominica* (Lesser Golden-Plover, *P. dominica*).
