## FROM THE PRESIDENT

Aren't I the lucky one! I've already kept my new years resolutions for the whole year. How could I do that, you wonder? I resolved to add to my life list one species per month! The Rio Grande Valley BSG/LOS Trip led by Charlie Lyon and Roger Breedlove yielded 12 lifers for me. This included: Masked Duck, Brown Jay, Red-crowned Parrot, White-collared Seed-eater, Mexican Crow, Green-tailed Towhee, Green Kingfisher, Ringed Kingfisher, White-tailed Hawk, Tropical Parula, and Sage Thrasher. And I have Green Parakeet in escrow awaiting ABA action.

One of the most memorable birds we saw can't be counted because it was a banded, hacked **Aplomado Falcon**. We watched overhead as it won a battle for control of air space with a **Merlin**. The **Aplomado Falcon** was the stronger, swifter, larger, and more colorful of the two falcon contenders. We watched the **Merlin** flee out of sight. I felt the **Merlin** was lucky to escape.

This fine trip yielded 213 trip birds, with all 5 days being 100+ species days.

## CHACHALACAS

### Lead In

The names of various species of birds permeates our English language. Some expressions that come to mind are: "happy as a lark," "my little chickadee," "he's an old buzzard," or Will Smolenski's favorite about "seeing a turkey in our group." I want to suggest an addition.

### Lead On

On a recent BSG/LOS sponsored trip to the lower Rio Grande valley, led by Charlie Lyon and Roger Breedlove, the group enjoyed the antics of the Plain Chachalaca. This large bird, about half the size of a turkey, provided us with comic relief entertainment. We watched a large flock in Brownsville travel single file from limb to limb and tree to tree. Desiring to roost across a major highway the flock flew one at a time with danger to life and feather.

### Get the Lead Out

Each take off was preceded by a cackling, raucous noise purported to be "cha cha lac." Also the morning song is said to be "keep-it-up," "keep-it-up," answered by "cut-it-out," "cut-it-out." It seemed sheer luck that the flock successfully avoided truck, bus, and auto traffic. A quick highway check showed no feathers from previous crossing disasters either. The white-tipped tail feathers showed prominently as each bird flared prior to landing. The whole process took from 5 to 10 minutes and was probably more orderly than it appeared. Two days later some of our group saw 48 Plain Chachalacas repeat the process while flying across the inner loop road at Benson in the Rio Grande Park.

We started saying things like, "it was time to chachalaca back to the van" or "let's chachalaca to the What-a-burger." I believe the saying is an apt addition to our idioms.     \*\*\* by Hubert Hervey

## BIRD QUIZ #19

### STATE BIRDS

1. Which bird is used as the state bird by more states than any other bird?
2. Which states have designated a chicken as their state bird?
3. Which states have state birds whose common name includes the name of the state?
4. Which states have state birds whose common name includes the name of a different state?
5. Four states have designated the Western Meadowlark as their state bird. Which states use the Eastern Meadowlark as their state bird?
6. Which state has designated a non-native bird as their state bird?
7. Which states have state birds named after a city in the state?

### ANSWERS TO BIRD QUIZ #18

1. Ptarmigans have feathered feet or "snowshoes" in winter which have been shown to increase their surface area by 400% and reduce the depth their feet press into the snow by 50%.
2. Gulls don't lose all of their body heat when they stand on ice or swim in icy water all day because of a system known as a counter-current exchange mechanism. The artery carrying warm blood to the feet and legs lies directly beside the vein bringing cold blood back from the feet. The heat from the artery is transferred to the venous blood as it travels towards the body. The end result is that the blood entering the feet is ice cold and the blood entering body is about the same temperature as the body and therefore very little heat is lost.
3. It is not really understood how the

**Golden-crowned Kinglet**, survives winter in the north woods. It is believed that they use fat reserves, all the food in their gut as well as fluffing their feathers to increase insulation and hiding their feet and legs in their feathers. They might also have a counter-current exchange mechanism as mentioned above. They might also roost in groups which would help to conserve energy. Work on the European kinglets does not support the idea that they become torpid. If you are interested in this topic see the February 1993 issue of Natural History.

4. Ptarmigans molt in the fall to blend in with snow.
5. Eastern Bluebirds may roost communally in nest boxes; up to 12 birds have been found roosting in a single box. Lawrence Zelany, the bluebird expert, suggests that nest boxes are not adequate for winter roosting and in his book he gives a blueprint for making a winter roosting box.

## MINUTES

The regular meeting of the SSNS Bird Study Group was held 11 December 1994, in the Museum of Life Sciences on the LSUS campus. The meeting opened at 7:10 p.m.

Members present voted to suspend reading of the minutes of the last meeting.

The treasurer's report was read: Pioneer account total at the end of December was \$1,215.16; income was \$124.59; expenses were \$119.14; Museum account balance is \$64.23. Total assets are \$1,220.61. Post office balance was \$84.31.

Hubert passed around an article from the Shreveport Times regarding the Christmas Bird Counts that was published

on Friday 24 December 1993. Members of the group pointed out that a second article was in the paper on Sunday 9 January 1994. Hubert read a letter from the Purple Martin Conservation Association thanking us for our contribution to the fencing along the causeway over Lake Ponchartrain. They also sent the BSG information on attracting Purple Martins, 12 reasons why people lose their Purple Martin colonies and 12 reasons why they fail to attract them. A form for registering your Purple Martin colony with the Purple Martin Conservation Association was also received. This information is available at the museum.

Information regarding an Ocean Liner-Birding trip of the Bering Strait (9 August 1994) sponsored by the American Birding Association was passed around; as were brochures for adopting a crane at the International Crane Foundation, Baraboo, Wisconsin.

Jim Ingold agreed to lead the field trip to Yearwood Rd on Saturday 15 January at 8:00 AM since Hubert will be out of town.

Paul Dickson presented the awards for the Bossier-Caddo-Bienville Christmas Bird Count. They included: *Most birds on the Hit List*: Charlie Lyon and Horace Jeter for finding 11 species; *Iron Binoculars Award* to Connor Nickleson for waiting out the fog on Lake Bistineau for 2 hours; *No Doze Award* to Jean Trahan, Jeff Trahan and Larry Raymond for the most hash marks on their tally sheet; *Golden Birdie Award* for the best bird to Brad McPherson for hearing two different groups of Wild Turkey.

**Bird Talk:** Ellen Tippett has had an unidentified hummingbird coming to her feeder at 517 Wayne Street for the last 6 weeks. It stays in the peach tree in her backyard and frequents the feeder on the Gazebo. She offered to have people come out and try to identify it. She gets home around 3:00 PM. Rosemary Seidler, Vickie LeFever, and Jean and Kathryn all

Trahan saw 4 Wild Turkeys and a Bald Eagle at Loggy Bayou. Paul Dickson and Hubert Hervey both have Harris' Sparrows coming to feeders on their farms. Rosemary Seidler mentioned that Al Smalley of Baton Rouge is very ill.

The main program was given by Mr. Michael Stroeh, Assistant Manager at the D'Arbonne NWR in northeast Louisiana. His talk was on the refuge and his work with the Red-cockaded Woodpeckers that reside there. He invited the group to come over and watch him catch and band woodpeckers and visit the refuge. A trip will be planned.

The meeting adjourned at 9:15 p.m.
