LAKE O' THE PINES

December 13, 1998

Anice Christmas present came just a few days early at Lake O' the Pines. The target bird for this Bird Study Group trip was a long shot, in my estimation. Cameron Cox had reported both **Western Grebe** and **Pacific Loon** to me just prior to our club's Christmas party, and I dutifully reported the same to our members as they enjoyed the food and auction. I delayed the trip a day because weather predictions called for drizzle, wind and fog. I wanted the best possible visibility in order to have the best possible chance at either of these two birds.

Pat, Roy Bott and I met Cameron, the trip leader, near the dam. It was bearably chilly. The lake waters rippled slightly in the breeze. A few hardy fishermen were already drifting across the lake with the breeze, or running their boats to favorite, more promising locations. **Double-crested Cormorants**, scaup and **Common Goldeneye** were flying away from the path of the fast moving boats.

An **Osprey** flew directly overhead, hovered and searched the shallows for a basking fish. We enjoyed its close proximity for several minutes. Later, we saw several **Bald Eagles**, up close; I must admit I enjoyed them a little more. What an imposing bird is the **Bald Eagle**!

At Alley Creek Camp Areas, a peninsula protruding along the northern lakeshore, we were scoping a young **Common Loon** that looked very similar to the exhausted bird some of you will remember from a barge trip on Cross Lake a couple of years ago. At the time it was a difficult identification call. The reason for mentioning this bird, at this point in the narrative, is because of the somewhat similar appearance it had to a **Pacific Loon**. Soon, Cameron mentioned that a loon he was looking at, in the opposite direction, was different from the others. I studied it at close range, under excellent visibility. The bird posed wonderfully at times, but at other times dove and acted more typically loon-like, that is difficult to scrutinize. We observed the thin bill, which lacked a distinct angle in the lower mandible, and the small head. Cameron announced "**Pacific Loon**", and the rest of us gained a life bird. It has been years since my last lifer. What a nice Christmas present! Thanks a lot to Cameron Cox for sharing his expert ability at bird identification with the rest of us.

Note: If you plan to go chase this bird, be sure to read up on loons in "Advanced Birding" by Kenn Kaufman before going. Otherwise, it would be possible to confuse a young **Common Loon** with a **Pacific Loon**, especially under less than ideal conditions. I did not attempt to describe the bird fully, especially the neck area, because "Advanced Birding" does it so well, and I am afraid the written word

would only result in confusion. Drawings are so much better.
