UPCOMING FIELD TRIPS AND EVENTS by Nancy Menasco

Beginning birders are welcome on all field trips. Membership in the BSG is encouraged but is not required for participation in field trips. Field trips will **LEAVE** the designated meeting place at the time posted for each field trip. Plan to arrive early for field trip orientation and any carpooling/caravanning arrangements.

What to bring on field trips: binoculars, two-way radios, scope, if you have one, snacks, and drinks. Unless otherwise noted, field trips will take place rain or shine, so bring rain gear if the weather's threatening.

BAYOU BODCAU WILDLIFE MANAGEMENT AREA

Meet at the U.S. Army Corps of Engineers' office near the dam at 8:00 a.m. If you heard Suzanne's fascinating presentation on Bodcau at the March BSG meeting, you know you don't want to miss this trip. Bayou Bodcau is an extraordinarily beautiful area with many diverse habitats. Nesting species include **Wild Turkey, Barred Owl, White-breasted Nuthatch, Northern Parula, Yellow-throated Warbler, Prothonotary Warbler**, and possibly **Swainson's Warbler** and **American Kestrel**. Our field trip will include areas of the WMA not open to the general public. Bring a picnic lunch and a folding chair.

Directions: From Shreveport or Bossier City, go east on I-20. At I-20 Exit 33, go left (north) on LA 157 a little less than 8 miles to Bellevue. At Bellevue, turn right on Bodcau Dam Road. Follow Bodcau Dam Road; it will go through the WMA Recreation Areas and across

the spillway. The Corps office is located on the road that leads to your left on the far side of the dam. You can see the office and the Durden House from the Bodcau Dam Road. The trip takes about 45 minutes from southeast Shreveport. We will bird in the area around the office for awhile so that we don't leave anyone behind.

NABA BUTTERFLY COUNT

This is the fifth annual North American Butterfly Association (NABA) count for Shreveport. Butterfly counts are very similar to bird counts. The 15-mile diameter count circle for the Shreveport count is centered on the intersection of Norris Ferry Road and Overton Brooks Road. This area includes much of southeastern Shreveport, Wallace Lake, Keithville, and a small portion of Bossier Parish. If you live within the circle, you may participate by counting butterflies in your yard or you may count in a designated portion of the circle. Contact Jeff for forms and instructions. LOWER MISSISSIPPI VALLEY SHOREBIRD COUNT

This annual count began in 1999 and is sponsored by the Lower Mississippi Valley Joint Venture Shorebird Monitoring Program. The objective of the Joint Venture is to ensure that adequate habitat for migrating shorebirds is provided on managed public lands as a safety net during years when habitat conditions outside of public lands are poor. The count is designed to provide two types of data: "Reliable estimates of shorebird numbers across the entire region at intervals in migration" and "estimates of turnover rates (how long are birds staying at a particular site)." To this end, you are asked to count during fall migration on designated weekends in August and September. You may count wherever you like for as long as you like. Enter your observations directly into the database at www.lmvjv.org/shorebird. Visit the website to learn more about the program and to register. Remember to report your observations to the BSG database as well.

***The First Book of Birds* by Olive Thorne Miller**
(Houghton Mifflin Company, The Riverside Press, Cambridge, MA, 1899)

A Book Review: Part Four
by Hubert Hervey

My sister discovered this book, *The First Book of Birds* (published in 1899), while going through some of the items in the estate of her mother-in-law. It is a "book intended to interest young people in the ways and habits of birds, and to stimulate them to further study." I found it quite interesting, and wished I could share some of the author's thoughts with members of the Bird Study Group. The prosaic style of writing and the simplistic acceptance of the ways of our friends in the bird world might seem quaint to the advanced scientific thought processes of our day, and yet I feel that over a century ago they had something we have lost in our world. There are eight full-page color pictures of birds, and nine full-page black-and-white pictures in the 144 total pages from which I have extracted the following tidbits. I can't explain it well, but if you will read with a slower pace than usual, so that you may absorb more of the intent of the writer, maybe you can tell me what I am feeling. The best way I know to convey the author's meaning is to quote a bit from each chapter. I hope you get a feeling for the early era of ornithology, as the story of birds, studied in the late 1800's, unfolds.

Reviewer's note: The following excerpt has been taken exactly from the original source, with only an occasional change in word arrangement to facilitate the

meaning in the original. Any errors are copied as originally written with no editorial effort, in order to retain the essence intended by the author. Section titles are printed in bold; chapters are printed in italics.

“HIS RELATIONS WITH US. *How he works for us.* Scientific men in the service of the United States government have had thousands of birds killed to see what they were eating, and have found out that nearly all the birds they have examined - do us more good by the injurious creatures they destroy, than harm by the fruits and vegetables they eat. To this there is among the small birds, but one exception, the English sparrow, and, of the large ones, only the two hawks and one owl previously mentioned. A great deal of refuse, dead sea creatures and other matter, is thrown up on the seashore, or floats on the water. On this feed the water birds, -herons, gulls, terns, and others. Indeed, on the shores where so many herons have been killed, to get their plumes for ladies hats, the result has been sickness and death among the people, as told by Dr. Gaumer, of Yucatan.

How to attract him about our homes. In countries where people are gentle, and try to make birds happy, instead of shooting them or throwing stones at them, they become very tame. Travelers who visit Norway tell us that birds are never disturbed there, and they come freely about the houses. When it is very cold they even come into the houses for food and warmth. The one great necessity, in both city and country, is water for drinking and bathing. It should be in a shallow dish never more than two inches deep, always be clean, and fresh two or three times a day. For food, they will eat any table scraps of meat, and vegetables, and bread, chopped fine and most kinds of grain, broken up, or crushed, for the smaller birds. But the thing they all like best of everything is raw suet, as it comes from the butcher. A lady living in southern Ohio, who has for several years given a breakfast to the birds every day in winter, told me that her daily guests last season were hairy and downy woodpeckers, nuthatches, white and red-breasted, on young kinglet, a pair of chickadees, tufted titmice, blue jays, juncos, cardinal grosbeaks, Carolina wrens, and sparrows.

How to study him. To really know the living bird, to make acquaintance with the individual, to see his family life, his manners, his intelligence, his powers, - this kind of study has hardly begun. This almost new and most attractive field is open to us to-day. It offers a charming study, with the added interest of discoveries to be made. Above all, be exact in your knowledge and do not jump at conclusions. If you see a bird on a fruit-tree picking about the blossoms, do not decide offhand that he is spoiling the fruit; look closely to see if he is not, instead, clearing it of worms that would destroy it all. Although

patience and clear eyes alone will open many delightful secrets of bird life, a good opera glass will do still more. You can see thus much better, not only his markings, but what he is doing. You will lose our desire to take life or even to steal eggs from them; the country will have new charms for you; in fact, a person blessed with a love of the study of birds or beasts or insects possesses a lifelong and inexhaustible source of interest and happiness.”

Black Vulture Nest

One afternoon Marilyn and I drove to the home of Don Griffith to see a vulture nest. The “nest” was the floor of a deer stand and belonged to a **Black Vulture**. Two eggs and one adult were present. The eggs seemed fine and had been moved (by the adult?) about ½ meter from their original position when discovered on April 29 (Figure 1). The adult was photographed at the nest by Betty Griffith on April 29 with a Polaroid camera by just holding it up to the window. I have continued to monitor this nesting and the pictures below (Figures 2 and 3) are of the one hatchling chick and the remaining failed egg. The location is 12651 Johns Gin Road (0.7 mi. S on Johns Gin Road from Springridge-Texas Line Road, Caddo Parish).

BIRD REPORT – *compiled June 1, 2005*

Use the bird report to see what other birders have been seeing and where to go find the bird you want to see. Observers are abbreviated by the first and last initials. Dates and localities of observations are summarized under the observer's initials. Sightings are arranged by species. Following each species is a line of data in the following format: date, initials of the observer, number of birds observed, initials of another observer, number of birds they observed, etc. For the number of birds observed, a 1 is used for both 1 bird and for numbers not reported by the observer. For example: 01/12/99 BB 2 means that on January 12, 1999, BB saw two birds. Then by looking on the observer list, located after the sightings, you can determine that BB is Bob Birder and on 1/12/99 he was birding C. Bickham Dickson Park.

Report bird records for the newsletter to Mac Hardy by the 15th of each month. All bird records reported here are observations of the observers and are therefore the responsibility of the observer.

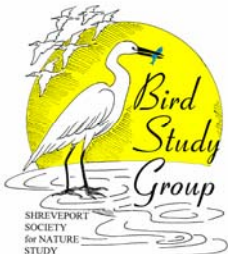
