UPCOMING FIELD TRIPS AND EVENTS

Beginning birders are welcome on all field trips. Membership in the BSG is encouraged but is not required for participation in field trips. Field trips will **LEAVE** the designated meeting place at the time posted for each field trip. Plan to arrive early for field trip orientation and any carpooling/caravanning arrangements.

What to bring on field trips: binoculars, two-way radios, scope, if you have one, snacks, and drinks. Unless otherwise noted, field trips will take place rain or shine, so bring rain gear if the weather's threatening.

LOS WINTER MEETING, LAPLACE, LA

Friday, February 2 - Sunday, February 4, 2007

The New Orleans area bird clubs are sponsoring the annual winter meeting. Information and registration forms for the meeting are or will be available at the Louisiana Ornithological Society website at www.losbird.org/meetings.htm. Headquarters for the meeting is the Quality Inn LaPlace. If you are planning on attending, please reserve your room now by calling the Quality Inn at (985) 652-5544. The deadline has passed for the special LOS rates but you can always ask.

Our quoted special room rates were \$78.99 for a single or a double, \$83.99 for a triple and \$88.99 for a quad. The price includes a hot cooked breakfast beginning at 6:00 a.m. Mention that you are with the Louisiana Ornithological Society; our group number is 100477.

Field trips planned include trips to Venice, Bayou Sauvage National Wildlife Refuge, Big Branch Marsh National Wildlife Refuge, Bonnet Carré Spillway, and a canoe trip led by Byron Almquist.

Membership in LOS is not required to participate in any of the LOS meetings, but you are encouraged to join to support the activities of our state society. Annual dues are \$20 for a regular membership and \$25 for a family membership. LOS is for birders of all levels, amateur or professional. Three meetings are held each year with programs on Friday and Saturday nights, organized field trips on Saturday and, for the winter meeting, also on Sunday, and a banquet on Saturday night. The spring meeting is the last weekend in April; the fall meeting is the last weekend in October; and the winter meeting is held in different locations around the state, usually the last weekend in January or in early February.

GREAT BACKYARD BIRD COUNT

This year marks the tenth Great Backyard Bird Count (GBBC). The count has expanded past the backyard to include anywhere you choose to bird. The BSG has enthusiastically participated in this annual event over the past several years and we hope that all of you will consider getting involved this year.

The BSG database lists over 175 species that have been found in our area in the month of February, including rarities. Download a February (or any other

monthly) checklist from the BSG website at www.birdstudygroup.org/SelectMoCheck.html.

For the second year, awards will be given to localities with the highest number of species, the highest number of birds sighted, and the most checklists submitted. There is also a photo contest. Complete instructions for participation are available on the GBBC website, but the guidelines are simple: For each day of the count period, report the highest number of a particular species recorded at each location you bird. For example, on day one of the count, in your backyard you have one **Northern Cardinal** at 10:00 a.m., five at noon, and two at 2:00 p.m. You report five **Northern Cardinals** for your backyard (the highest number present at one time) for day one. You go birding the same day at Richard Fleming Park, where you spot six cardinals in one location. You report six **Northern Cardinals** for Richard Fleming Park. You start all over again for days two, three, and four.

To learn more about the count and to enter your reports, go to www.birdsource.org/gbbc. Record entry is a simple process. The following instructions are from the GBBC website. If you don't find a particular species listed on the GBBC checklist for Louisiana, you may need to click on "Show this checklist with rare species included" at the top of the checklist page.

At the end of the day, go to "**Submit your bird checklist**" on the GBBC web site. Fill out the questions about your location, local habitat, and count duration. Then enter your high counts for each species sighted on that day and location. You can submit one bird checklist for each day that you count or for each new area that you count in. For example:

- If you count on four days at one location, you'd submit four different checklists.
- If you count on four days at two different locations each day, submit eight checklists. And so on.

A Fantastic Day For a Hawk Watch (Five Days after the Celebration)

The main flight of **Broad-winged Hawks** had failed to materialize as September, 2006 was winding down. I always look forward to a day when a hundred or even rarely two hundred hawks migrate over my farm in northern DeSoto Parish. But 2006 had failed to produce any strong cool fronts that would initiate a major hawk movement over north Louisiana. That is until September 28, 2006. Conditions were good the previous day, with cumulus clouds following the passage of a front, but only a few hawks passed by. Thursday, the 28th was predicted to be cloudless; not perfect hawk watch conditions. Indeed as I checked the weather about 9 a.m. the sky was cloudless, and doomed to stay that way. However, at 10:05 a.m. Terry Davis called and said he was seeing a few Broad-wings at a location about twelve miles north of me. He started counting them, and got to 70, counting by ones, when I decided I needed to finish the job I was doing. I was outside at 10:15 a.m. Ten minutes later the biggest kettle of **Broad-winged Hawks** it has been my pleasure to see in Louisiana started gathering right over my head. I counted the milling throng, looking like a buzzing of bees, far

overhead. I got to 550, and decided that wife Pat needed to see this bubbling brew of Broad-wings. I tried to dash inside, and ran right out of my moose hide moccasins. My binoculars crashed to earth, under my chest. Flesh will always lose this nature of battle, and I still have the bruises to prove it. Pat missed this flight, but at 11:15 a.m. I was able to get her out in time to see another flight of 155 Broad-winged Hawks. Later another four came over playing catch up. The day's total of 709 broad-wings is a high count for our area. How many more broad-wings passed over north Louisiana that day? Rosemary Seidler reported 480 over Eddie Jones Park, a location 15 miles west of mine, at 3:00 p.m. certainly a different group. Those seen by Terry Davis might have been a different group also. All these hawks were streaming south-southwest, on an upper level airflow in a very clear blue sky, regrouping to kettle only once while in sight, and covering real estate rapidly. Also, they were binocular only birds, not likely to be seen by the naked eye. The following weekend at Hazel Bazemore County Park, northwest of Corpus Christi, the official hawk count had over 110,000 **Broad-winged Hawks**.

Crawfish and Waterbirds – What We Do and Don't Know About Their Interactions in Aquaculture Situations

The modern Louisiana crawfish industry is about 50 years old and has grown from around 40 hectares in 1950 to over 52,000 hectares in the year 2006. Waterbirds have vexed crawfish farmers since the industry's earliest days. Flocks of several thousand birds in ponds are regularly encountered and such high densities of crawfish predators and competitors would appear to be potentially detrimental to crawfish production. Our report summarizes information about the problems, real and perceived, associated with various waterbird species in crawfish ponds. As yet, no definitive studies have determined whether or not "perceived" problems are "real". However, "perceived" problems cause concern among crawfish farmers and should be of concern to those charged with addressing wildlife damage complaints.

Concern about waterbirds involves several issues. Direct predation on crawfish is a clear issue. Birds are also competitors for crawfish food resources, including invertebrates, small vertebrate animals, and un-harvested seeds. Birds impact harvesting by removing bait and/or crawfish from traps as well as knocking traps over permitting crawfish to escape. Finally, some birds dislodge emergent vegetation that functions as crawfish

substrate, by providing protective cover, reducing absolute density per unit area and providing access to the surface during periods of low dissolved oxygen. Specific bird groups include: grebes, pelicans, cormorants, egrets, herons, night-herons, ibises, spoonbills, storks, geese, dabbling ducks, diving ducks, coots, shorebirds, gulls, and terns.

Information about control methods for dispersing birds including non-lethal harassment, exclosures, management of water depth and vegetative cover, and crawfish trap modification will be presented. The seasonality of "problem" birds varies and will be discussed. Birds are present throughout the year. Although most crawfish are invulnerable in burrows during the summer when rice crops are often grown in fields, some farmers report waterbird problems then. These will be explained. Finally, the relative importance of crawfish pond systems for various waterbird species will be presented.

Some in the conservation community argue that waterbirds may have beneficial impacts on crawfish production. Because stunting is related to high crawfish densities, reduction in crawfish numbers could enhance production of larger, more valuable crawfish. Cycling of nutrients to macrobenthos and zooplankters, both important crawfish food organisms, might also benefit crawfish production. These issues will be discussed.

During the past two decades, approximately 100 waterbird species have been documented using Louisiana's agricultural wetland complex. An additional 180 species of birds, native and migrant, have been recorded in adjacent riparian areas, bottomland hardwood forests, and marshes. The significance of these "artificial" wetlands adjacent to the state's disappearing coastal wetlands, over 70,000 hectares in the past half century, cannot be overstated. Likewise, the expansion of crawfish culture along the Red River and Ouachita River valleys into central and northern parts of the state has provided significant shallow water and moist soil habitat for birds moving toward the coast in fall migration or from the coast in spring migration.

Birding in Oregon and California September-October 2006

I was in Oregon and California birding from 29 September through 8 October 2006. I made the trip through BirdTreks – Bob Schutsky, Peach Bottom, Pennsylvania [www:birdtreks.com] . I chose this tour primarily because Bob is the only bird tour operator I have found who intentionally targets the Cameron area in Louisiana for birding tours each spring. Bob's list for the Oregon tour was very interesting with a potentially spectacular pelagic trip. I also wanted to learn more about his efforts to promote birding in the Cameron area.

Several of us arrived on the 28th and birded the following morning, the 29th, in riparian areas along the Columbia River near the air port while waiting for other folks to arrive. We left in early afternoon for Newport and had several birding stops along the way at the coast finding **Heerman's** and **Mew Gulls** at Tillamook Bay. We stopped at one site noted for exposed mud flats at "high" tide in Lane's guide to check for shorebirds. Needless to say, we found few shorebirds!

On the 30th of September we birded along the coast with stops in places like Siletz Bay and Boiler Bay. We had excellent birding from the shore finding **Brandt's** and **Pelagic Cormorants**, **Harlequin Duck**, **Common Murre**, **Black Oystercatcher**, **Black Turnstone**, **Black**, **White-winged**, and **Surf Scoters**, and **Surfbird** along with several loons and grebes. Gray whales seemed to be all over the place. An **Eurasian Wigeon** showed up in a huge flock of **American Wigeons** in a large, shallow bay. We found **Western** and **Glaucous-winged Gulls** as well as many hybrids of the two species. Talk about confusing birding! We found my first **Chestnut-backed Chickadee** at a roadside park where we had lunch.

The pelagic trip on the 1st of October was the highlight for my tour. We traveled to Heceta Bank guided by Greg Gillson, roughly 30 miles offshore. We were treated to large numbers of seabirds and very smooth seas, a rare condition for most pelagic birding trips. I had two target birds, any puffin and any crossbill. Timing was terrible for puffins because they had long since departed from their breeding sites and were widely dispersed across the Pacific Ocean. However, we cruised right up to a winter plumage **Tufted Puffin** that allowed our boat to cruise around it so all could see its coal black plumage and bright orange bill. I managed the following lifers at sea: **Black-footed Albatross**, **Northern Fulmar**, **Pink-footed**, **Buller's** and **Sooty Shearwaters**, **South Polar Skua**, **Pigeon Guillemot**, **Marbled Murrelet**, and **Cassin's** and **Rhinoceros Auklets**.

Pomarine, **Parasitic** and **Long-tailed Jaegers** were literally all over the place once we got out of sight of land. We stopped to chum birds around noon and the first bird to arrive was a magnificent adult **Sabine's Gull**, a lifer as well. We got so close to a Gray Whale that the boat passed through its exhaled breath immediately after it broached. The smell was horrendous! We left the coast on the 2nd of October and tried for **Spotted Owl** at a site recommended by a guide on the pelagic trip. While we did not find the owl, I was treated to two lifers, the **Varied Thrush** and my other target bird the **Red Crossbill**. When we stopped to pick up food at a discount store, I birded a bit in a patch of blackberries near the store. I pushed a beautiful **Townsend's Warbler** (a lifer) out of the briars. We "padded" numbers on our Oregon list in Finley NWR in the Willamette Valley. I saw dozens of **Cackling Geese** at the refuge. There were many shorebirds and waterfowl at the site. We spent the night in Eugene and were up early for a visit to Crater Lake.

We did a lot of driving on the 3rd of October to get to Crater Lake National Park but the trip was worth it. The scenery was great. We managed a very cooperative **American Dipper** at one pull off along a mountain stream. We made a stop more or less in the middle of nowhere and were rewarded with a **Red-breasted Sapsucker**. We found a **Prairie Falcon** in the pumice field on the north side of the crater. We ate lunch at the first scenic overlook of Crater Lake and were treated to a low flying **Golden Eagle**. We found good numbers of **Clark's Nutcrackers**, **Gray Jays**, and **Golden-crowned Sparrows** at the Crater Lake recreation area. From Crater Lake we went south to Klamath Falls, Oregon.

We spent the 4th of October mostly in northern California in the Tule Lake area. We found close to 80 different birds. We saw a number of different waterbird species along with thousands of ducks on the various shallow water impoundments in the area. In the course of an hour, we found **Pied-billed**, **Horned**, **Red-necked**, **Eared**, **Western** and **Clark's Grebes**! Some highlight birds in California included **Sandhill Crane**, **California Quail**, **Canyon** and **Rock Wrens**, and **Townsend's Solitaire**. A **Loggerhead Shrike** was a big deal for everyone but me. Just across the border in Oregon, Bob spotted a distant raptor. We stopped to watch it and subsequently identified the only **Ferruginous Hawk** of the tour which dove for a meal in a pasture and remained in the area providing excellent views with our scopes. It wasn't clear if the hawk actually caught something

because a **Red-tailed Hawk** chased it from the site where it had made its attack.

The 5th of October was spent in the Klamath refuge complex in Oregon. That's where we finally managed, after a lengthy hunt, to find a couple of **White-headed Woodpeckers** including one that "posed" for us on a low snag for a full 5 minutes! On the shores of Klamath Lake we found a mixed flock of feeding songbirds that included both **Townsend's** and **Hermit Warblers**. I was fortunate that our tour's co-leader John Puschock spotted a **Ruffed Grouse** standing on a log in heavy cover about 10 yards off the road as our van moved along at a fair rate of speed. We quickly backed up and the bird stayed put long enough for me to get an excellent view of it. We had hoped to find one or more **Great Gray Owls** but instead, we found a **Great Horned Owl**. Unfortunately, **Great Horned Owls** make short work of **Great Gray Owls**, explaining their absence from one of the best areas for the birds near Fort Klamath.

We traveled north to Portland on the 6th of October. We did a lot of traveling but had some decent waterfowl birding in the Willamette Valley in the William L. Finley National Wildlife Refuge with two highlights. We found a small flock of **Cinnamon Teal** on one pond unit. Later, we searched a small copse of oaks for woodpeckers and found a very colorful **Acorn Woodpecker**.

We had originally planned to spend the 7th of October searching for whatever we could find at Sauvie Island National Wildlife Refuge. However, a **Red-necked Stint** had been reported at Florence on the coast during the week including the day before. So, we took a 3 and a half hour early morning ride to the beach at Florence. A bird that observers "felt good about" did make a pass over our stake out but never landed to permit positive identification. However, we were able to attract a **Wrentit** from the brush around the cove where we waited for the stint and later found a **Wandering Tattler** at the end of a rock jetty to provide two lifers for me. We were also treated to a great view of the tour's only **Rough-legged Hawk** that spent at least 30 minutes flying across the river inlet into very strong winds.

My bird list for Oregon exceeded 175 species. My bird list for California approached 80 species. I missed the one **Green-tailed Towhee**, a potential lifer, that one of our participants saw. However, it is hard to be unhappy about a trip that generated 30 life birds and over 60 year birds not to mention unique animals including seals, sea lions, dolphins, ocean sunfish, whales, deer, elk, tree and ground squirrels, and chipmunks, not to mention legitimate mountains, and

"dormant" volcanoes" sights very foreign to folks from Louisiana.

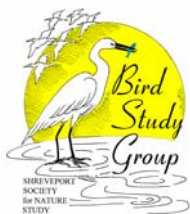

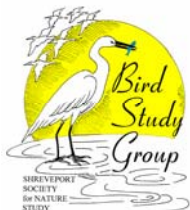
