LOS WINTER MEETING, ALEXANDRIA, LA **Friday, January 25 - Sunday, January 27, 2008**

The annual winter meeting of the Louisiana Ornithological Society returns to central Louisiana. With only a two-hour drive, hopefully many BSG members will be able to attend. Information and registration forms for the meeting will be available on the Louisiana Ornithological Society website at www.losbird.org/meetings.htm. Headquarters for the meeting is the Clarion Hotel, 2716 North

MacArthur Drive, Alexandria, LA 71303. A block of 30 rooms has been reserved; the rate is \$79.99 plus tax and includes breakfast. Call 318-487-4262 or 800-540-1880 to make reservations. Please mention that you are with the Louisiana Ornithological Society.

There will be field trips on Saturday and Sunday. Planned are trips to Cheneyville for Sandhill Cranes, Catahoula Lake, the NSU Aquaculture Research Center, Lost Bottoms Bayou and Kincaid Lake, and several Grant Parish National Forest locations for Red-cockaded Woodpecker.

The program on Friday night will take place at the Clarion Hotel and will include presentations by Laura Palasz on her research on Henslow's Sparrows in Louisiana and Jonathon Valente on his research on King Rails in Louisiana. The Saturday night banquet and program will be held at the Cajun Landing restaurant. Steve Shunk will speak on woodpecker conservation, including the trends of the Red-cockaded Woodpecker in Louisiana as well as in the U.S. He will also speak on RAMSAR sites, including where they are and their significance.

Membership in LOS is not required to participate in any of the LOS meetings, but you are encouraged to join to support the activities of our state society. Annual dues are \$20 for a regular membership and \$25 for a family membership. LOS is for birders of all levels, amateur or professional. Three meetings are held each year with programs on Friday and Saturday nights, organized field trips on Saturday and, for the winter meeting, also on Sunday, and a banquet on Saturday night. The spring meeting is the last weekend in April; the fall meeting is the last weekend in October; and the winter meeting is held in different locations around the state, usually the last weekend in January.

Minutes of the Regular Meeting

October 9, 2007, 6:30 p.m.

Museum of Life Sciences at LSUS

Program – Janis Harrison discussed her 2005 birding trip to Colorado.

Field Trips – Nancy Menasco said that the Big Sit would take place Saturday, October 14, in Bickham Dickson Park. Also on the agenda was the open house at the Red River Refuge Headquarters Unit on Saturday, October 20. At the open house Larry Raymond will give a talk on attracting wildlife with plants and Paul Miliotis will give a talk on dragonflies.

Membership – Mac Hardy reported that there are 85 paid members and 94 gratis members.

Bird Talk – Amanda Crnkovic said that there have been lots of wading birds at Bickham Dickson Park. Jean Trahan also reported **Common Moorhens** at the park. Jim Ingold learned from LABIRD that there are two flamingos in Cameron Parish in Calcasieu Lake. One is a **Greater Flamingo** and the other a **Caribbean Flamingo**. Jerry Bertrand saw a Bald Eagle in a tree at Red Ball Oxygen. Steve Bankston saw a **Greater Roadrunner** on LA-5 between Kickapoo and Keatchie. Paul Miliotis has been seeing **Red-breasted Nuthatches** in East Texas. He expects that we'll see many of them this winter. Nancy Menasco reported ten **American Kestrels** and a **Merlin** at the Louisiana Hill Farm Experiment Station.

Minutes of the Regular Meeting
November 9, 2007, 6:30 p.m.
Museum of Life Sciences at LSU

Program--Jim Ingold spoke about his project of bird banding in eastern Texas. The title of his presentation was "Winter philopatry of sparrows in NE Texas: a ten year bird banding summary."

Announcements—Amanda Lewis reminded everyone that the Christmas party will be held at the next meeting which will be a dinner and an auction. The BSG will provide meat and drinks. Club members will provide other items for the dinner and for the auction. Hubert Hervey will offer a half day trip on the upper Red River as an item in the auction. Amanda then thanked Dennis Forshee for the refreshments at this meeting. She then proposed a competition for the best Christmas tree ornament. Details for this contest will be in the next newsletter.

Membership—Mac Hardy said that he had BSG stickers and magnets to give out. He reported that the Kroger card program would terminate at the end of this year, but that it might be replaced with another program. He urged members to use the Kroger card until the end of the year because it provides income for the club. Mac said that he produced a new membership list of all people who have been members this century and urged members to pick up a copy if they needed one.

Treasurer's Report -- Jean Trahan reported that on October 31, the club had \$5,072.71 in the bank. In addition we had \$431.55 and \$842.43 in prepaid expenses at the post office and LSU printing, respectively. The fund balance is \$6,346.69.

Field Trips – Nancy Menasco said that there is a field trip scheduled for Saturday, November 24, but that she did not know at this time exactly what it would be. The schedule for Christmas Bird Counts (CBC) is as follows: Caddo Lake warm up count, December 1; Shreveport CBC, December 15; Claiborne CBC, Tuesday, December 18; Natchitoches CBC, December 22; and the BCBCBC, January 5. Nancy announced that the LOS winter meeting will be held in Alexandria.

Calendars—Nancy Menasco then asked club members if they would like to receive a calendar from the Barataria Terrebonne National Estuary Program (BTNEP). She described the calendar and said that each member would receive a calendar from BTNEP if the club provided a membership list to the organization.

The list would not be used for anything by BTNEP except for mailing these calendars to the membership. A motion was made to provide BTNEP with a membership list. The motion was then seconded and approved by the membership.

Bird Talk – Jim Ingold reported that Charlie Lyon saw three **Chestnut Collared Longspurs** at the sod farm on Sentell Road. Terry Davis reported late dates for **Broad-winged Hawk**. Nancy Menasco saw two male **Scissor-tailed Flycatchers** on US Highway 84 where it crosses Bayou Pierre. Jim Ingold then said that the late date for the flycatchers is in December. Shirley Huss reported hearing a **Bell's Vireo** in Bickham Dickson Park; however, she did not actually see it. Finally, Amanda Crnkovic saw a **Greater Road Runner** on Bert Kouns Industrial Loop near its intersection with I-49.

Committee Reports

Beginning birders: Field trips held the first and third Saturdays of each month, trips leave from the Wild Bird Center.

Bird Alert: Non-members on list? Board agreed that it was okay to have nonmembers on the bird alert.

Bird Hot Spots: Mac reported that we have had some sales of Hot Spots. Jerry asked for a copy of the Hot Spots to post electronically on the website.

Bird Records: There was a big bird report printed this time in the September newsletter, because the wrong report was produced for the June newsletter and the September issue will include the correct June report and those sightings for the September issue. Mac said he spends 6 plus hours each issue entering bird records. He inquired if the BSG could pay someone to enter these records. Mac made a motion to hire someone at minimum wage to enter bird records for the BSG. Jerry seconded the motion. A vote carried in favor of the motion, with all yes votes. The board suggested forming a committee to address the long-term status of the records contained in our database. Jim, Jerry and Mac

will start the committee. An announcement will be made at a regular meeting to ask for additional members.

Field Trips: annual hawk watch and BBQ will be September 22 at the Hervey's farm. Butterfly festival will be September 15th in Haynesville, the Big Sit is scheduled for October 14th. There was a discussion of moving the Big Sit location from C. Bickham Dickson Park to the Red River Refuge. The big Sit will take place at C. Bickham-Dickson.

Fund Raising: Door prizes are needed for the monthly meeting. Suggestions were made to have the plant sale in May and not June and to draw tickets to see who has first choice and to price each plant. Several suggestions were made for the Christmas auction. Suggest items were antiques, original paintings, bird photography, or rare books for auction.

Hospitality—Amanda suggested having a monthly meeting host. A host would bring snacks and set up the snack area for a monthly meeting.

Library: A volunteer is needed to work in the BSG library.

Newsletter: Jim Ingold said the newsletter would be ready to print and fold on Thursday and to mail on Friday.

Programs: Mac Hardy will present the September program. He will discuss his trip to the Borneo region.

Publicity: Amanda will ask at the next meeting for a volunteer to chair this committee.

Website: Our yearly charge for posting the web page is \$95.40. Payment options for this fee were discussed.

Old Business

Nancy made a motion to renew our \$100 membership in the Red River Refuge Friends Group. Jerry seconded the motion. The motion carried, with all yes votes.

New Business

Discussion on meeting start time. John Dillon suggests making the monthly meeting start 30 minutes earlier. A vote will be made at the general meeting.

Committee Reports

Field Trips: Nancy stated that LOS will have its winter meeting and have a Sandhill Crane field trip and asked if we still wanted to have a Sandhill Crane field trip as well? The board thought we should offer our trip and Jim agreed to lead our field trip. An owl prowl will be scheduled for January and the annual bird banding will be February 23rd at Paul Dickson's farm.

Fund Raising: Christmas auction items are needed.

Ornament competition idea was announced and discussed. To participate make an ornament that is in some way bird or Bird Study Group themed. If you aren't crafty, don't worry – ornaments can be anything that you have bought/found and modified (either slight, by writing BSG on a store bought ornament, or extreme modifications, your imagination is the limit). BSG members will be asked to vote for the best ornament at the Christmas party. The winner will receive a prize. The winning ornament will be sold during our live auction. All other ornaments will be sold during the silent auction.

The question was asked if we should consider fundraising outside of our club. The board requested a year to date statement to determine our financial situation.

BIRD REPORT – *compiled December 2, 2007*

Use the bird report to see what other birders have been seeing and where to go find the bird you want to see. Observers are abbreviated by the first and last initials. Dates and localities of observations are summarized under the observer's initials. Sightings are arranged by species. Following each species is a line of data in the following format: date, initials of the observer, number of birds observed, initials of another observer, number of birds they observed, etc. For the number of birds observed, a 1 is used for both 1 bird and for numbers not reported by the observer. For example: 01/12/99 BB 2 means that on January 12, 1999, BB saw two birds. Then by looking on the observer list, located after the sightings, you can determine that BB is Bob Birder and on 1/12/99 he was birding C. Bickham Dickson Park.

Report bird records for the newsletter to Mac Hardy by the 15th of each month. All bird records reported here are observations of the observers and are therefore the responsibility of the observer.

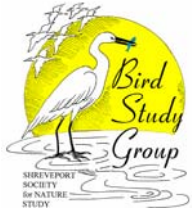

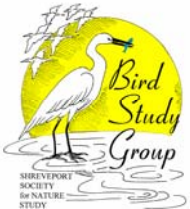
