Bachman's Sparrow

On May 23, 1993, Horace Jeter, Charlie Lyon, and I were birding the Loggy Bayou Plantation area in Bienville Parish. Charlie and I were working some rugged land for Worm-eating Warblers which we never found. Horace stayed near the car and located a singing Bachman's Sparrow. Both Charlie and I heard the bird singing later, but only Horace had a really good look at it. The location is on Bienville Parish road 509 toward Ringgold from Paul's place. If you are going toward Lake Bistineau on 509 you will see a large tower on the right. Go ³/₄ of a mile, park and listen for the song in an area of short pine regrowth in a recently cut over (cont. p. 3)

Answers to last month's quiz.

1. The Brown Creeper normally builds its nest under a loose piece of bark on a tree.

2. The corvids (crows, ravens and jays) probably share the intelligence title with the parrots.

3. Eclipse plumage is a dull, cryptic plumage attained by male ducks in the non-breeding season. This plumage is quite often accompanied by a complete loss of flight feathers which makes the males incapable of flight and requires them to stay on the water until they regrow their flight feathers.

4. Birds always face into the wind because their feathers face backwards and if the wind was at their back, the feathers would be lifted up and they would lose the insulating property of the feathers.

5. Woodpeckers have the longest tongues. It is attached to the skull just under the skin at the base of the upper mandible and travels around the top and back of the head. The woodpecker uses the long tongue to extract insects etc. from the holes they drill. Most woodpecker tongues are barbed but the tongue of the sapsucker is like a bottle brush to pick up sap.

MINUTES: LAST MEETING

The regular meeting of the SSNS Bird Study Group was held 11 May 1993, in the Museum of Life Sciences on the LSUS campus. The meeting opened at 7:10 p.m.

Minutes of the last meeting were approved.

The treasurer's report was read:
 Pioneer account total is \$1,404.05; income was \$45.00; expenses were \$55.00 ; Museum

account total is \$249.77; and \$56.09 in our post office account; and our total assets are \$1,699.91.

The next site guide will be for Soda Lake (Mac Hardy) which will be followed by one for the Red River Experimental Station (Bill Wood).

A field trips list was passed out. Jim Ingold took over the Soda Lake trip 22 May for Mac Hardy who will be out of town.

Jim Ingold asked people to collect checklists for the library as they travel around this summer.

Betty Mason read a letter from the Nature Conservancy thanking us for supporting them in the past year and asking us to renew our membership.

Nature Stamps that will be required to use state wildlife areas will go on sale 1 June 1993. The cost is \$10.00.

Visitors included Nelwyn C. McInnis a Botanist/Ecologist with the Nature Conservancy and Judy Teague who is studying natural areas in Caddo and Bossier Parishes for her Masters thesis with LSU-BR.

Hubert passed out extra copies of the newsletters that were passed out last meeting.

A map of the Migration Count area was passed around. We counted 111 species by 7 groups.

Information on the Logo contest will be presented at the next meeting, after the board has a chance to firm up the idea.

Sixty species were seen during the field trip to Walter Jacobs,

including Cerulean Warbler. About 50 species were counted at Hubert's Big Day, despite the rain. The LOS spring meeting brought a list of 106 species for the Saturday count. A fallout occurred Sunday morning so the final list may have been over 200 species.

Birdtalk included the following seen by Charlie Lyon at the I-49 Barrow Pits: White-rumped Sandpiper, Pectoral Sandpiper, Black-necked Stilt, Anhinga, Wilson's Phalarope, and Cliff Swallow. Charlie had also seen Bobolinks. Bill Wood had 86 species in 4 hours at Bickham-Dickson with 14 species of warblers. Hubert and Pat Tuminello had Scarlet Tanagers and Hairy Woodpeckers feeding young.

A local Audubon Chapter in Uncertain, Texas is being started with a cost of \$35.00.

A reminder for membership in the LOS was given.

Rosemary introduced Paul Dickson who talked on birdwatching in Europe.

The meeting adjourned at 8:45 p.m.

Report on NAMC

The North American Migration Count for our area was a big success. Seven teams of birders counted birds in designated parts of Caddo Parish. The weather on May 1, 1993, was delightful - a huge reason to consider participating in this annual count. We turned up 113 species by days end -- a respectable total that I'm guessing we can beat next year. The count-totaling get-together at Larry Raymond's home

was very enjoyable. Thanks Larry for the food and for arranging to have a Red-shouldered Hawk nest with parents and nestlings in your front yard.

We could easily have used 3 or 4 more teams of counters. The national results will be published and copies made available for all participants. These results are in the form of maps showing migrating species density on May 1st.
